Belknap Mill Launches 6th Season of Kids in the Park

Beginning Wednesday, July 2, the Belknap Mill will kick off its 6th year of Kids in the Park, a beloved summer series offering fun, educational, and family-friendly activities every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday throughout the month of July. All events begin at 10:00 AM and are free to attend, taking place in Rotary Park or inside the historic Belknap Mill Museum, depending on weather.

The series brings together local organizations and artists to engage children in creative and active play. Mondays feature the return of North Country Center for the Arts' IMPACT Theatre, with 45-minute live fairy tale performances held on the 3rd floor of the Mill. These interactive shows are designed specifically for young audiences and are a highlight of the weekly schedule.

Wednesdays and Fridays in Rotary Park include hands-on programs and special guests throughout the month. Children will have the opportunity to dance and move with Miss Katie from Dancing Feet Studio, make a commercial for the radio with Heather Bishop and Lakes Media, and explore hiking safety with Lakes Region Search and Rescue and NH Fish & Game. New to the series this summer is Lakes Region Vale Tudo, bringing exciting demonstrations and beginner-friendly instruction in boxing and mixed martial arts—adding a fun and energetic new twist to the lineup.

Whether you're a returning family or a first-time visitor, this summer's program promises engaging experiences for children of all ages. "Kids in the Park has become one of our favorite summer traditions," said Jill Desruisseaux, Associate Director at the Belknap Mill. "It's all about creating joyful, enriching experiences for families while connecting them to our community's history, creativity, and resources. Every year we see new faces and returning families, and we're thrilled to welcome them back for another summer of fun."

Fireworks Safety



FIREWORKS are often used to mark special events and holidays. The only safe way to view fireworks is to attend a professional show. With many professional firework shows being canceled this year, it is important to know that **fireworks are not safe in the hands of consumers**. Fireworks cause thousands of injuries each year.

A few ideas to get into the patriotic spirit, without fireworks:

1. Use glow sticks, they glow in the dark and are a safe alternative to a sparkler. Fun for all ages.
2. Loud and proud. Noise makers are sure to make a statement. They can be found at local party supply stores or make your own.
3. Outdoor movie night. Set up a screen and projector. Don't forget the bugspray!
4. Red, white and blue silly string...fun for all ages.
5. Make a patriotic craft with the family.
6. Throw a birthday party for the USA, and don't forget the cake.



FACTS

- ! More than 19,500 reported fires are started by fireworks annually.
- ! Burns account for 44% of the 9,100 injuries treated in emergency rooms seen in the month around July 4.
- ! Half of the fireworks injuries seen at emergency rooms were extremities: hand, finger, or leg. One-third were to the eye or other parts of the head.
- ! Children ages 10–14 had the highest rate of fireworks injury, with more than one-third (36%) of the victims of fireworks injuries under age 15.
- ! Sparklers account for roughly one-quarter of emergency room fireworks injuries.

Laconia Historical & Museum Society – A Journey Through Rail Service in the Lakes Region

A presentation on the evolution of rail service in the Lakes Region, including the Laconia stations, will be held on Thursday, July 10th, at 5:30 p.m. at the Gilford Public Library. This free program is open to the community and is part of the Laconia Historical & Museum Society's 'Our Yesterdays 2025 Presentation Series.'

The Laconia Passenger Station has played a significant role in our community, historically serving as a vital hub for transportation and the movement of goods. The completion of the Lake Shore Railroad in 1890 connected Alton to Laconia and linked with the Boston, Concord, and Montreal lines. This development opened up routes to the Seacoast, Boston, and Montreal, transforming Laconia into a railroad crossroads. However, what was missing was a grand structure to symbolize its importance. Plans were quickly set in motion to replace the original station with "the best structure of the kind," as noted in the Illustrated Laconian in 1899.

The presentation will trace the historical timeline from the railroad's inception and the construction of the passenger station in the mid-to-late 1800s to present-day operations.

Laconia Historical & Museum Society Receives \$10,000 Grant from New Hampshire Preservation Alliance & The 1772 Foundation

A \$10,000 grant has been awarded to LHMS to support the Society's first project of their "Legacy of Laconia Heritage Preservation Campaign," a new initiative dedicated to making the needed repairs and upgrades to protect and preserve the society's collections.

The N.H. Preservation Alliance, in partnership with The 1772 Foundation, awarded grants totaling \$125,000 to seventeen private non-profit organizations in New Hampshire to assist in preserving their historic structures. "This year, The 1772 Foundation's investment in New Hampshire is protecting and revitalizing seventeen historic buildings, positively impacting communities by bringing needed capital investment to important community landmarks," said Beverly Thomas, deputy director of the Preservation Alliance.

The initial project for LHMS, pertaining to the "Protect the Collections" phase, aims to replace the deteriorated and leaking roof of the late 19th-century building located in downtown Laconia. This necessity is urgent, as the rental space contributes to operational expenses, and the society's archival collections are housed on the premises. "Replacing the roof will significantly contribute to protecting and preserving the story of Laconia, ensuring that we, along with future generations, can continue to learn about the people, places, and events that have shaped our city. We are incredibly excited and grateful to The 1772 Foundation and the NH Preservation Alliance for the opportunity and support," said Tara Shore, President, Laconia Historical & Museum Society.

The New Hampshire Preservation Alliance strengthens communities and stimulates local economies by encouraging the protection and revival of historic buildings and places. 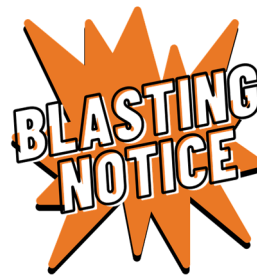

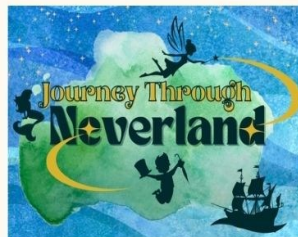

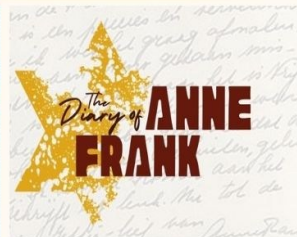

Our Yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past...

THEN ...

Main Street, Laconia, is seen, June 24, 1900 — 125 years ago this week. The conflagration damaged the Mallard, Mitchell and Burleigh blocks, at center, but they were rebuilt and continued in service until another fire, Oct. 30, 1928, destroyed them, once and for all. The space was then occupied by a new, two-story brick Keller-Bean Block, which stood on the site until 1970, when it was demolished during the city's Urban Renewal Program. Also see '125 Years Ago' on opposite page. Those who have copies of 'Laconia' in the Arcadia 'Images of America' series (published in 1995) may wish to note the correct date of the fire pictured (p. 55). ... AND NOW

Following demolition of the Keller-Bean Block, the city's Municipal Parking Garage was erected on a site spanning the distance from Mill Street to the Winnepesaukee River. (Site of the 1900 fire would be approximately to the left of the street light with flag.) Stores on the lower level of the garage began to open, 50 years ago, one of the longer-lasting businesses being Keller's on the Mall — later known as the Soda Shoppe — around the corner at left, which eventually succumbed, a couple of years ago.
