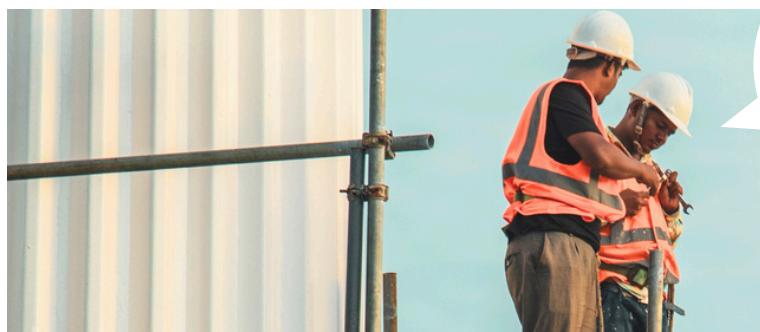

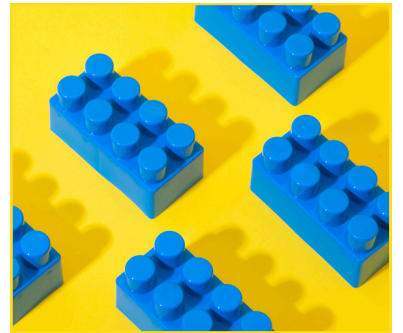

RECIPE CORNER

Ingredients

- 1/3 cup heavy cream
- 3tbs unsalted butter
- 1 vanilla bean
- 1tsp pure vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp kosher salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2tsp dark rum

Dark Rum Caramel

From *The Campout Cookbook: Inspired Recipes for Cooking Around the Fire and Under the Stars* by Marnie Hanel & Jen Stevenson

1. Warm the cream, butter, and vanilla bean seeds, vanilla extract, and salt in a small saucepan over low heat until the butter is melted, then remove from the heat.
2. In a 2-quart saucepan, mix together the sugar and 3tbs water, then simmer over medium-high heat, without stirring, until sugar turns amber (8-10min).
3. Turn off the heat, add the cream mixture, and whisk until smooth (the caramel will froth and foam wildly).
4. Whisk in the rum. Let the caramel cool, transfer to an 8oz mason jar, and refrigerate for up to 2 weeks.

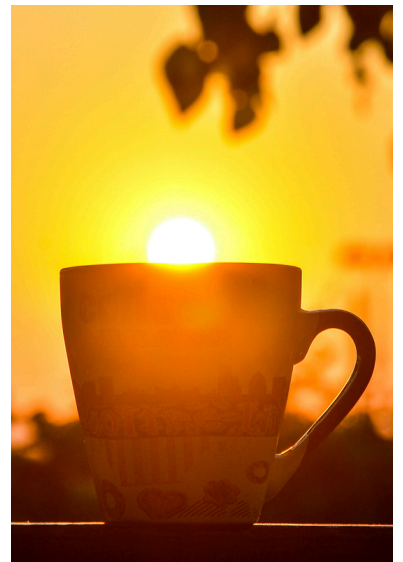
DEATH CAFÉ

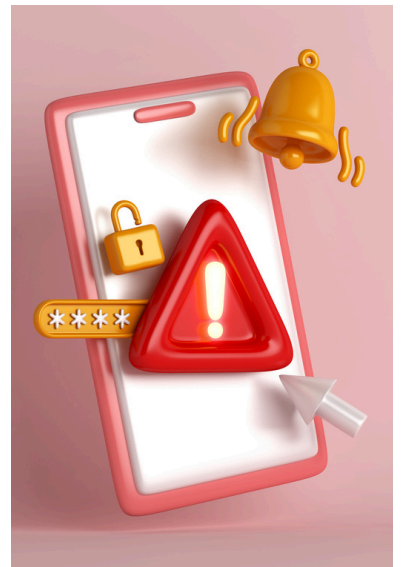
FRAUD BASICS

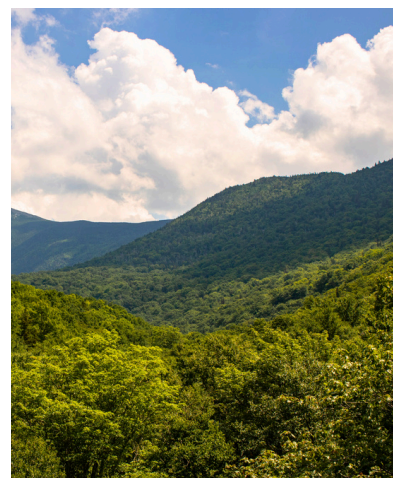
A HISTORY LOVER'S GUIDE TO NEW HAMPSHIRE WITH KATHLEEN BAILEY

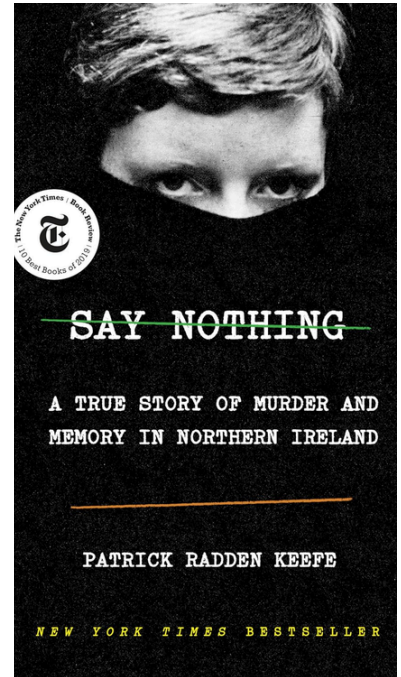
"**SAY NOTHING**" BY PATRICK RADDEN KEEFE

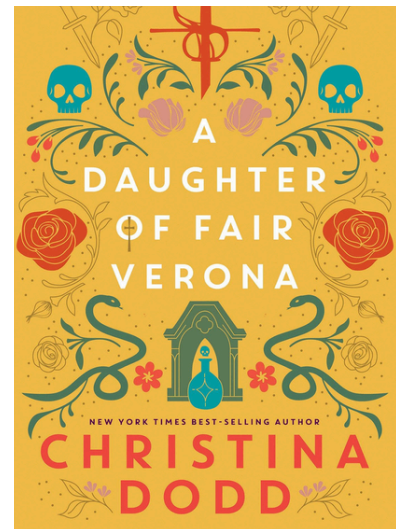
MYSTERY BOOK CLUB

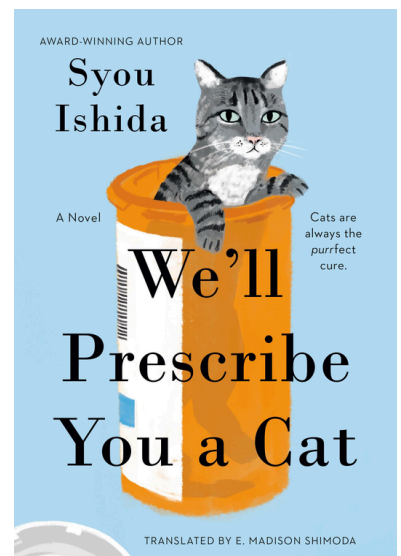
"**WE'LL PRESCRIBE YOU A CAT**" BY SYOU ISHIDA
