The Police Department can fine violators!


The first offense is a \$25 fine. The second offense is \$75 and the third offense is \$150.

Our next soft plastics, Styrofoam and food drive collection is scheduled for Saturday, August 23rd from 11 am to 1 pm. Please be sure to check our Facebook Page for any changes www.facebook.com/UULaconia/ and here at Laconia Links.

The Laconia-Gilford Lions Club and UUSL (Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia) Green Sanctuary volunteers will be out in front of the church at 172 Pleasant Street on August 23rd from 11 until 1pm. We are collecting # 6 Styrofoam, soft plastics, and single-serve sized pop-top canned food for our Community Action Program (CAP). Additionally there is need for travel-sized hygiene products, towelettes (Wet Ones), hand sanitizers, personal care products (Depends for men and women).

Soft plastics and Styrofoam must be clean and free of labels. Plastics cannot be any snack bags, candy wrappers, any product wrapping that is "crunchy" sounding. Mailers are acceptable. No bird seed or pet food bags can be collected.

We are pleased and proud that your community saved from the landfills some 1,100 pounds of soft plastics at our last collection. All that is saved for collection is converted into composite decking and furniture.



EBENEZER SMITH, MEREDITH'S PRIME MOVER: BIOGRAPHY OF A FOUNDING FATHER

Rudy VanVeghten was born and raised in Manchester, Vermont. He began his career as a journalist at the Meredith News in 1973, spending most of that time as editor.

After leaving Meredith in 2001, Rudy worked in publications and website management at his alma mater, Northeastern University in Boston, until moving back to Meredith following his retirement in 2020.

VanVeghten is the author of five books on Meredith history. The most recent, "Ebenezer Smith, Meredith's Prime Mover: Biography of a Founding Father," delves deep into the life and times of the one individual who championed the cause of settling the township that today encompasses Meredith, Laconia, and Center Harbor Village.

NOAA Weather Radio (NWR)

Going for a boat ride, hike, or camping this summer? Pack your NOAA Weather Radio. Having access to weather alerts 24/7 is like having a smoke alarm for weather alerts, and it doesn't depend on cell service or power. In an era where connectivity is crucial, NOAA weather radios stand out as a vital tool for safety, providing round-the-clock alerts and updates from the National Weather Service, even in the most remote areas. Here's what to know:

What It Does: Receives official alerts from the National Weather Service, including tornadoes, flash floods, hurricanes, and more—even in the middle of the night.



Choose the Right Type: Look for models with battery backup, hand crank, or solar charging. Some even come with USB ports to charge your phone in a pinch.

Program Local Alerts: Use the SAME (Specific Area Message Encoding) feature to filter alerts just for your county or region—no more unnecessary noise.

Set It and Forget It: Leave it plugged in with the alert function on. It'll sound off automatically when danger is near—even if you're asleep.

A small, inexpensive tool with the power to warn you when every second counts.







THEN ...

The John C. Moulton House, on North Main Street, Laconia, is seen around 1880, with the North Church (Congregational) at right, before it was enlarged in 1869-1871. The railroad tracks run just beyond the Moulton House, which was being operated as a hotel — the Crawford House — 125 years ago this week, but which had been acquired by the city after Moulton's death in 1894. Meanwhile, Moulton had left the lot between the house and the church to the city as the site for a library or other public building. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Moulton House was dismantled and the site is now part of the park surrounding the Gale Memorial Library Building, which was built on the land to the right of the house and opened in June 1903. The church — which extended halfway into Church Street, was moved to its current location, in Veterans Square, in 1903, to become the Peoples, then Christian and, later, Evangelical Baptist churches and, today, the Chaos and Kindness Experience, or CAKE..
