

Did You Know? Our modern celebration of Thanksgiving was set in stone less than a century ago! On October 6, 1941, the United States Congress passed a resolution fixing the traditional *last-Thursday* date for the holiday beginning in 1942. However, in December of that SAME year, the Senate passed an amendment requiring that Thanksgiving be observed annually on the *fourth Thursday* of November, in order to prevent confusion on the occasional years in which November has five Thursdays.






MYSTERY BOOK CLUB




FICTION BOOK GROUP

RECIPE CORNER

MAMA'S BROWN SUGAR SEMOLINA WITH JAM SAUCE

From *The Sweet Polish Kitchen* by Ren Behan

1. In a saucepan, gently bring the milk, brown sugar, vanilla, and butter to a rolling boil. Pour in the semolina, turn down the heat to low, and stir continuously until the mixture thickens. This will take at least 10 minutes. Take care so that the mixture in the bottom of the pan does not burn. Remove from the heat, cover, and keep warm.
2. Place the jam in a saucepan and heat gently, adding 1-2 tablespoons of water and stirring until you have a sauce consistency.
3. Serve the semolina pudding warm, with the jam sauce.

Ingredients

- 3 cups milk
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tbsp butter
- 1/2 cup semolina
- 1/2 cup jam of your choice
- 1-2 tbsp water
