The State of New Hampshire is under a statewide open burning ban, which became effective September 22, 2025 and will continue until further notice, due to severe drought conditions and high wildfire risk.

These drought conditions are expected to continue well into the Fall, resulting in the potential for large fire activity.

The ban prohibits all open fires, including campfires and brush fires, and also restricts smoking in or near woodlands.




THEN ...

Downtown Laconia is seen from the new U-shaped Main Street Bridge, as it looked in 1975 after completion of the city's Urban Renewal Program — which had begun in the 1960s. The Downtown Mall at that time was a pedestrian-only space, with a planter, surmounted by five flagpoles, at the near (south) end. Building directly above and to the left of the hotel later collapsed under weight of snow in 2008. (Detail from photo in 1975 Laconia City Directory)



... AND NOW

The planter — at 200 tons, too heavy for the bridge — was removed in 1977 and the street reopened to one-way vehicular traffic, July 8, 1994. Ten years ago this week, in 2015, a total rebuilding of the bridge and creation of a new 'Gateway Plaza,' at right, was celebrated. See this week's '10 Years Ago' on this page.
