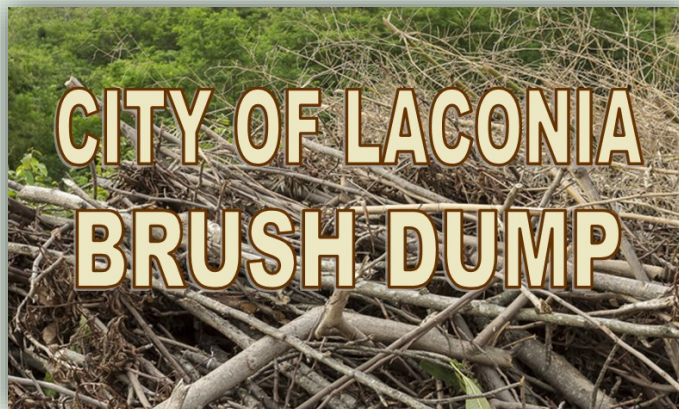

Laconia Brush Dump Closes October 7th due to drought's impact

Brush and tree limbs brought to the Brush Dump are burned. The

fire danger from the drought is so great the Governor imposed a statewide burn ban. Laconia Public Works during the drought has not been burning brush to minimize the chance of fire escaping and endangering the neighboring houses.

The amount of brush brought to the Brush Dump during the drought period has nearly approached the point where burning the brush would be a danger to the neighborhood, even during non-drought conditions.

Winter is approaching and as part of the preparations, Public Works trims low hanging tree limbs and brush that may cause problems with plowing the streets. The little remaining space in the Brush Dump is just enough for the brush generated by Public Works during its snow preparations.

Public Works is closing the Brush Dump effective October 7th due to the volume of brush in the dump. City staff will be monitoring drought and rain predictions to determine when the Brush Dump can open to the public or if an alternate means of chipping the brush must be implemented to restart the service to Laconia's residents.

The State of NH is under a statewide open burning ban, which became effective Sept. 22, 2025 and will continue until further notice, due to

severe drought conditions and high wildfire risk.

These drought conditions are expected to continue well into the Fall, resulting in the potential for large fire activity.

The ban prohibits all open fires, including campfires and brush fires, and also restricts smoking in or near woodlands.

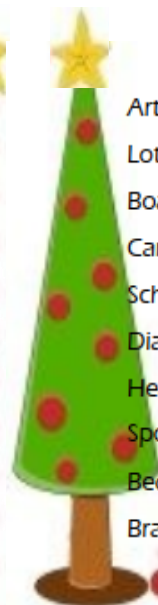

City of Laconia Residents,

The City of Laconia's Master Plan Steering Committee will meet at the **Belknap Mill on October 6, 2025 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM** to kick off City's master plan update. The purpose of the master plan is to set down as clearly and practically as possible the best and most appropriate future development of the area under the jurisdiction of the Planning Board, to aid the Board in designing ordinances that result in preserving and enhancing the unique quality of life and culture of New Hampshire, and to guide the Board in the performance of its other duties in a manner that achieves the principles of smart growth, sound planning, and wise resource protection (RSA 674:2). State law recommends municipalities review and revise their master plans every five to 10 years (RSA 674:3). Our current master plan was adopted in 2018 and should be revised to address the current challenges and needs of our residents.

This kick-off meeting will review the scope of rewriting the master plan as well as the project milestones and timeline over the next year. We will also go over how members of the public can participate and track the status of our new master plan. Furthermore, we will also review our proposed public outreach plan to gather as much public input as possible. This is our time to come together and develop the best plan for the City of Laconia and its residents.

This kick-off meeting will review the scope of rewriting the master plan as well as the project milestones and timeline over the next year. We will also go over how members of the public can participate and track the status of our new master plan. Furthermore, we will also review our proposed public outreach plan to gather as much public input as possible. This is our time to come together and develop the best plan for the City of Laconia and its residents.

At this first meeting, the City Council, Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Conservation Commission, and Heritage Commission will engage in a Vision exercise to gather their input on what the City of Laconia will look like over the next 15 years. This will be the first step to crafting an updated Vision Statement. We will then review the chapters of the Master Plan to be updated during this process including Land Use, Economic Development, Transportation, Housing, and Community Facilities chapters.

Finally, this first meeting will conclude with a public comment period for residents to ask questions about the process, next steps, and how to participate in the process. We very much look forward to working with you in the coming months as we plan to move the City forward together.

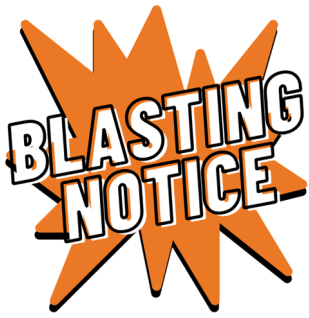

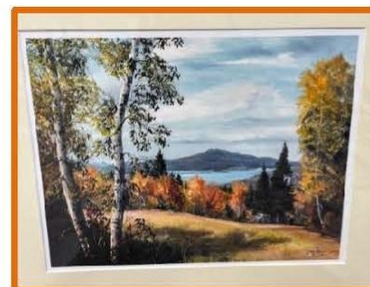

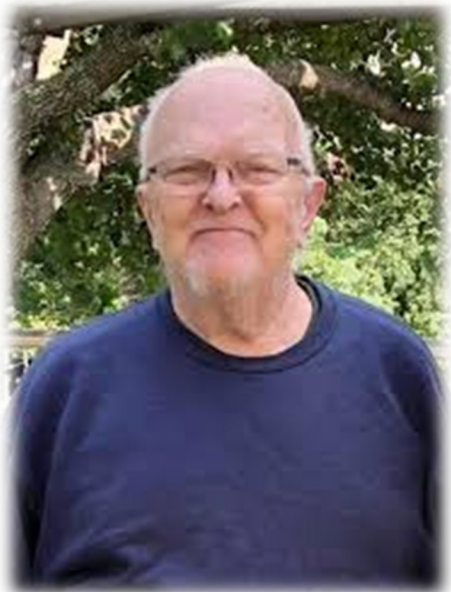

Laconia Historical & Museum Society Presentation: The History of the Taylor Community

A presentation by Warren Huse on The History of the Taylor Community will be presented on Wednesday, October 8th, at 6:30 p.m. at Woodside at Taylor Community.

Drawing on selected information from David Bonshurst Hart's 226 page study titled "Historic Roots of the Taylor Community: A Continuing Care Retirement Community Founded in 1907," Huse will lead attendees through important aspects of Hart's work, including the founding of the Laconia Home for the Aged, Edward Taylor's contributions to the Home, and key events related to the governance and growth of the Taylor Community. He will include insights from officials, residents, historical societies, libraries, and other sources.

Warren Huse is a native of Laconia and a graduate of Dartmouth College. He served 21 years on active duty in the Army, primarily as an Infantry officer. Since 1990, Warren has been writing the weekly "Our Yesterdays" column for The Laconia Citizen and, later, The Laconia Daily Sun. He is also the author of four books on Laconia's history and has contributed as an editor or co-editor on three additional works. For over 40 years, Warren has been actively involved as a board member of the Laconia Historical & Museum Society, holding many positions during this time. His extensive historical knowledge has made him a valuable resource for the Laconia community and beyond, earning him the well-deserved title of "Town Historian."

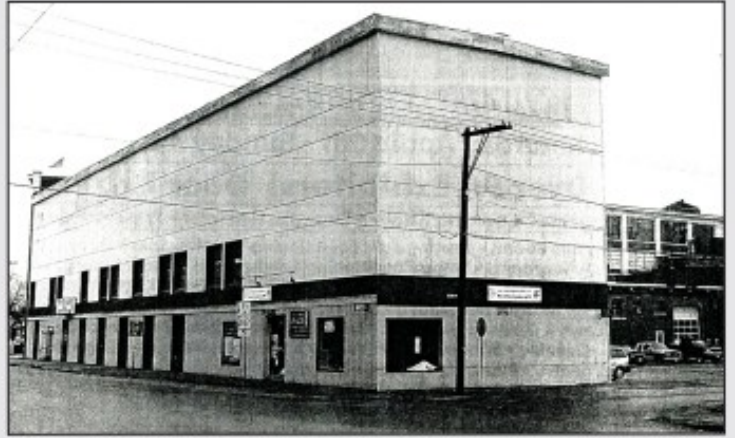
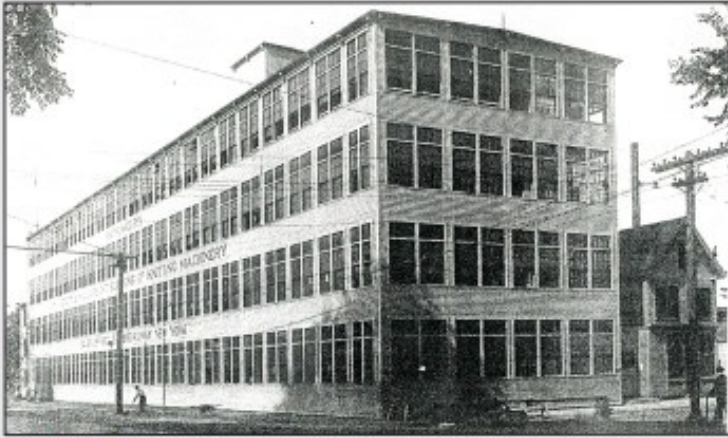
