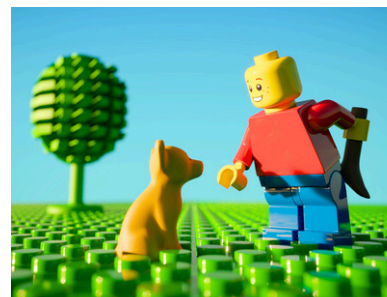

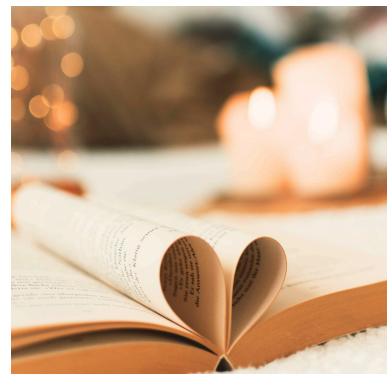

### CANDY CANE FUDGE

From *What's for Christmas Dinner?* by Sarah Rossi.

1. Line the base and sides of an 8" tin with baking paper.
2. Put the chocolate, condensed milk, and peppermint extract in a large microwaveable bowl and microwave in 30-second bursts (*mixing well after each burst*).
3. Pour into the lined tin, smooth out, and quickly sprinkle with chopped candy canes. Take a fresh piece of baking paper and use it to press down carefully all over the surface of the fudge so the candy canes are firmly indented into the fudge.
4. Refrigerate overnight to set.
5. Turn out the fudge, remove the paper, and cut the fudge into 36 small chunks.

#### Ingredients

- 1 2/3 cups dark chocolate - broken into small pieces
- 14oz condensed milk
- 2 tsp peppermint extract
- Candy canes - cut into very small pieces

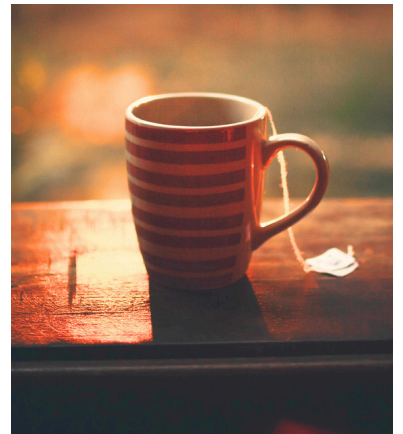
## DEATH CAFÉ

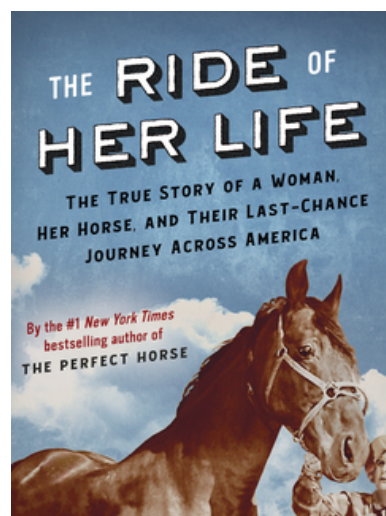
#### "THE RIDE OF HER LIFE" BY ELIZABETH LETTS

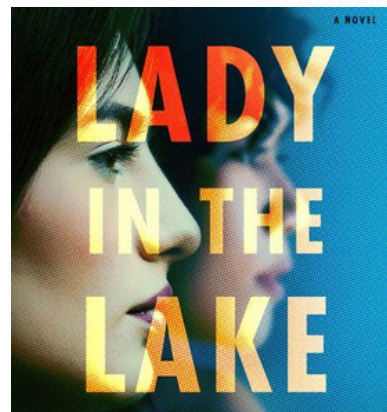
### MYSTERY BOOK CLUB
