Public Works UPDATE

Please note that all signs, chairs, tables and other items that you may have on the City's sidewalks in the downtown area are no longer allowed to be on the sidewalk after November 1st.

This allows Public Works' crews to plow and treat the sidewalks during the winter. Next spring if you desire to again place these items on the City sidewalks, you will need to submit new sidewalk encumbrance permits. Please call Public Works at 603-528-6379 for more information.



Winter parking ban begins November 1

As of November 1, vehicles and trailers cannot be parked on a public street from midnight to 6:30 am. This allows Public Works crews to plow snow piles back against the curb and clear snow from the streets when there is little traffic on the street.

Vehicles parked on a public street during this time may be ticketed or towed at the discretion of the Police Chief or the Public Works Director. The fine for parking on a public street during these hours is \$25.00.

Hilliard Road Brush Dump

From November 1st to March 31st, the City of Laconia Hilliard Rd. Brush Dump, located at 325 Hilliard Road will be open for winter hours!

It will be open every Friday and Saturday from 10 am to 2 pm, unless it is snowing.

If there is a snowstorm, this facility will be closed as all Public Works personnel are involved with snow removal.

Residents using this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker or a day pass.

We accept clean wood only (not painted, stained or pressure treated). Wood and tree branches must be no longer than 3 feet with a diameter of 3 inches or less.

Leaves are not accepted at the Brush Dump.






NH DMV EXPANDS APPOINTMENT-BASED SYSTEM

CONCORD, N.H. – The New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) announces it will be increasing access to services by transitioning to a fully appointment-based system beginning Monday, November 3, 2025.

"This change is designed to reduce waiting times in DMV lobbies and provide a more efficient, personalized experience for all customers," said DMV Director John C. Marasco. "By scheduling appointments in advance, the DMV can manage customer flow more effectively, ensuring that each visit is timely and well-organized."

The DMV conducts over 425,000 in-person transactions at 14 locations around the state each year. Starting November 3, additional appointments will be available to accommodate customer volume. The busiest DMV locations in Concord, Manchester, Nashua, and Epping will also offer appointments during extended hours until 5 p.m., twice a week. Additionally, a limited block of same-day appointments will be made available each day for customers with urgent transactions.

Customers can find appointment availability or [the DMV website](http://dmv.nh.gov), where they can select "Make an Appointment" on the homepage. DMV staff will assist walk-in customers with finding appointments, including at other DMV locations if necessary.

The members of the DMV remain committed to providing exceptional customer service by offering online transactions and improving our in-person customer experience.


**Please move your

Winter is fast approaching and Public Works and NHDOT are preparing the public streets and sidewalks for snow plowing.

One item that our residents can help with is moving their portable basketball hoops that are on or near the roads and sidewalks so they will not be hit by plow trucks and tractors. The hoops can damage the snow removal equipment, or the equipment can damage the hoops themselves.

Please immediately move portable basketball hoops at least 5 feet back from the edge of roads or sidewalks as the weight of the snow coming off from the plows can knock portable basketball hoops over, damaging them and anything that may be in their path.

- Mask off to cross: Keep full vision when near roads.
- Stick together: Young children should be with an adult; older kids should share their route and stay in groups.
- Check treats: Look over candy before eating; avoid anything unwrapped.
- Costumes: Choose non-restrictive footwear and flame-resistant materials.
- Drive extra slow: Expect heavy foot traffic in neighborhoods from 5–8pm.
- Pets & porches: Secure pets and keep walkways well-lit and clutter-free.

Bridge Work at Elm Street Nears Completion

Next Phase of Lakeport's Revitalization Set to Commence Soon

Pictured left: The deck rehabilitation of the Elm Street bridge in Lakeport – looking south from Franklin Street - is nearing completion. During bridge work, alternating one-way traffic has been necessary.

Built in 2003, the Elm Street Bridge is undergoing its first major repairs required to maintain its anticipated 75 to 100-year lifespan. Working closely with the city, the WOW Trail Committee launched the first phase of the Opechee Loop in conjunction with this maintenance.

By coordinating their efforts, the sidewalk on the bridge deck has been widened at lower cost and with fewer traffic disruptions. The committee leveraged WOW Trail funds, \$325,000 in grant funding (\$100,000 from Belknap County and \$225,000 from the Northern Border Regional Commission), and the remaining amount of approximately \$575,000 from the Lakeport Tax Increment Financing District fund—created to support transportation and infrastructure improvements.

“Being able to do both projects at the same time has allowed the city to make additional upgrades to the area while staying under budget” said Assistant Director of Laconia Public Works Nate Guerette. “We hope for another 20 to 25 years before this type of major bridge maintenance is necessary.”

The WOW Trail Committee will also allocate \$100,000 in a collaboration with Lakeport developer Scott Everett to begin the next phase of a project that will tie the widened sidewalk from Doris Ray Court to the WOW Trail terminus, adding to Lakeport’s revitalization. Construction on this section will begin shortly, with major groundwork establishing the base for new public space. Paving, landscaping, and hardscaping will follow in spring–summer 2026, creating a promenade-style segment

“The goal of this project—and the Opechee Loop—is to provide safer routes for bicyclists and pedestrians connecting neighborhoods with schools, parks, beaches and business districts,” said Allan Beetle, president of the WOW Trail Committee. “Building the Opechee Loop is another step toward economic vitality for our business districts and better transportation and recreation options for the community.”

The current Opechee Loop concept includes sidewalk and pathway enhancements up Elm Street to Route 106, continuing through the proposed Laconia Village into Ahern State Park to Shore Drive, and ultimately reaching the WOW Trail downtown at Pleasant Street.

Pleasant Street is the only additional sidewalk improvement anticipated for this connection. The city has been selected to receive a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant to help fund the next section—from Franklin Street to Elm Street School—targeted for 2028.

“We will continue partnering with the city, the state, and private developers to build out this vision—especially when roadwork or planned development lets us minimize costs and impacts,” Beetle said.

Laconia City Clerk, Secretary of State Provide Laconia Voters with Important Information on Election Law Changes

Effective September 30, there are additional requirements related to absentee voting and absentee registration.

CONCORD, NH (September 30, 2025): New Hampshire Secretary of State David M. Scanlan and Laconia City Clerk Katie Gargano remind Laconia voters and individuals who qualify to register by absentee or to vote absentee of important election law changes that take effect on September 30, 2025.

Absentee registration changes

Effective September 30, any individual registering to vote by absentee for a qualified reason must provide proof of their U.S. citizenship and age in addition to domicile and identity with their registration application.

Individuals in New Hampshire can register to vote by absentee due to temporary absence or physical disability. More information on the process is available on the [Secretary of State's website](#).

Absentee voting change

Effective September 30, registered voters who request an absentee ballot must show proof of their identity to receive their absentee ballot. If sending their absentee ballot request by mail, the voter must include a copy of their photo identification or a notarized signature on their absentee ballot application form. If the voter is obtaining their absentee ballot in person, they must show their city or town clerk photo identification (digital proof is also accepted) or a notarized signature on their absentee ballot application form.

The deadlines to request absentee ballots remain the same. Voters must request their absentee ballots by 5 p.m. in person the day before an election or by 12 p.m. the day before the election by mail or email.





THEN ...

This was Gold Street, in Lakeport, as it appeared around 1960, looking toward the Winnipesaukee River in distance. House at near left had served briefly as a passenger station for the railroad in the early 1850s, before it was moved here from Elm Street. Two buildings at near right were at one time stores, later the Frank W. Johnson Boatworks and McDuff Machine Co. Small Cape, glimpsed in distance at right, dates from 1785, when it was the home of a member of the Gale Family. Two-story building with ornate roofline, at right beyond the Cape, was, at one time, Henry O'Dell's store and, later, the Laconia Tire Co. of Robert A. Hough. Steeple of Second Advent Church, on Belvidere Street, rises in distance above the Hough property. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)

House at left is still there, but other buildings beyond it have been replaced by boat storage for Lakeport Landing Marina. The former Johnson Boatworks building remains at 65 Gold St., but the other store (McDuff, earlier Edwin L. Cram, dealer in groceries, hardware and general merchandise) was replaced by another boat storage facility of Lakeport Landing Marina in 2004. The Gale Cape and Hough building are still there. Opening Day for the new Landau store, at the corner of Main and Hanover streets, Laconia, Nov. 2, 1950, brought out crowds. The modern structure replaced the three-story wooden Perley Block and a tenement house which had stood on the site for many years. (Laconia Public Library)
