

News **From the Laconia Water Department**

Prevention Is Better Than Reaction

If the temperature inside a house gets below 32 degree Fahrenheit (0 degree Celsius) it's likely that the water supply pipes and the drain traps will freeze. When water freezes it expands 9 percent, and if there is no room for expansion it's possible that the pipe will develop a crack and eventually leak once the ice thaws out. Fixing a burst pipe can be expensive, but the damage from uncontrolled water leakage can easily reach into the thousands of dollars.



The majority of the calls received for frozen water pipes and water meters are a result of inadequate heating and cold air drafts where piping is located in the home. It is recommended that property owners check their property for these conditions and identify the location of their water meter and shutoff valve before an emergency.

If for any reason you cannot stop the flow of water from a frozen or broken pipe, call the Water Department's 24-hour emergency number at 524-0907.

Please help yourself and your neighbors by shoveling a nearby fire hydrant!

There are more than 500 fire hydrants in Laconia. It can take City fire-fighters several days to shovel all the hydrants. In addition to shoveling the hydrants the crews must respond to emergency calls. We are averaging 13 calls each day so it can take several days to shovel every hydrant. These devices are very important to help protect your home in the event of a fire.

Take a moment and shovel or snow blow the fire hydrant in your neighborhood! Remember, it is against the law to push snow against a fire hydrant. If you plow snow against a fire hydrant you will be fined.



Construction on the Catio Project is Underway!



The NH Humane Society is so pleased to be working with Paul Fleming, of Paul V. Fleming & Sons LLC, who successfully bid on the shelter's expansive "Catio" project. After several months of unavoidable delays, Paul and his crew are now on-site and construction is underway! Completion of the space is anticipated in January 2017, and will be accessible to the cats who reside in the largest feline social room.

"We are very excited to finally get this long-awaited project underway," said Marylee Gorham, Executive Director of the NH Humane Society.

"Once completed, this new structure will allow three season enjoyment of the outdoors while assuring safety and a cozy spot for so many cats calling our shelter home. Happy cats are healthy cats, which in turn will facilitate adoption into loving homes."

The project came to fruition only because of the generosity of donors who understood the need to provide a stress-less environment for cats at the New Hampshire Humane Society. Improving the living space for upwards of 100 cats waiting forever homes has long been a goal at the animal welfare agency,. Now with a fully funded project, expansion is underway.

Carbon monoxide poisoning threat increases in the winter



The Laconia Fire Department wants to warn everyone about the hazards of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. Recently, a father and young son in Massachusetts died from CO poisoning. Carbon monoxide is one of the leading causes of accidental poisoning deaths, and accounts for more than 50,000 emergency department visits each year in the US. During the cold weather months, we will seal up our homes to keep in the heat. Moreover, we simply stay indoors for longer periods in the winter months. Many elderly people stay in their homes for extended periods. This can lead to a medical emergency which can be fatal, caused by a build-up of carbon monoxide (CO) in the blood stream.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a deadly, colorless, odorless, tasteless and toxic gas. Nicknamed "the silent killer", it is totally undetectable by human senses. If there is CO in the air you breathe, it will enter your blood system the same way oxygen does, through your lungs. Carbon monoxide then displaces the oxygen in your blood. When the CO displaces enough oxygen, you suffocate.

Since carbon monoxide is released when fuels don't burn properly, any fuel-burning appliance, vehicle or tool that is not correctly vented or maintained can be a source of deadly carbon monoxide gas. Some examples: gas stoves, furnaces, water heaters, wood stoves, coal stoves, fireplaces, pellet stoves, gas dryers, kerosene heaters, and generators can generate CO. If the heat equipment is defective, or has a bad vent system, the build-up of CO can be rapid and fatal.

Many newer furnaces allow for vents to be located on the outside wall with no chimney. Check the location of low level outside vents. They can easily become covered in snow and not vent dangerous gases from your home or business. This is a serious problem with seasonal homes when the furnace may be used intermittently and snow is allowed to bury the vent.

Purchase and place a CO detector in your home if you use any type of heating equipment that burns fuel such as wood, coal, or gas. A small leak in a chimney can allow CO to seep into your home. If the home is well insulated the gas will not escape. You should place CO detectors on each level of your home, especially near the appliances that can produce CO. If you can only afford one device, place it outside the bedrooms. CO has the same buoyancy as ambient air so the device can be placed on the ceiling or wall, or plugged directly into an outlet. Battery operated CO detectors usually come with a 10-year battery. Always look for the UL label.

Never run your car in the garage. A car engine produces enormous quantities of CO and can quickly overcome the occupants. Never use an outdoor grill inside your home. Do not use a gas oven to heat your home. Do not use any gasoline-powered engines (snow blowers, generators) in your home/garage, or near doors or windows. Do not sleep in any room with an unvented gas or kerosene heater. Follow the safety instructions on any portable heating device.

A serious problem with CO poisoning is that a person affected will feel tired. Unknowingly, the person or persons will go to sleep and possibly never wake up. That is why CO is known as the silent killer. You cannot see or smell the gas. Only a CO detector will tell you that it is present.



Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide (CO) Poisoning:

Long-term exposure to low concentrations of carbon monoxide (CO) can gradually build up in the blood causing flu-like symptoms such as headaches, fatigue, nausea and drowsiness. Exposure to high concentrations of CO will cause throbbing headaches, breathing difficulties, confusion, loss of consciousness and heart problems. Symptoms of CO poisoning are so common they are often misdiagnosed. As a general rule, carbon monoxide poisoning should be suspected if more than one member of the family becomes ill (including pets) and if they recover after being away from the home for a period of time. Senior citizens, infants, young children, pregnant women and people with breathing or heart problems are at the greatest risk of CO poisoning.




If you think you are experiencing symptoms of CO poisoning get outside in the fresh air immediately and call 911 for emergency assistance. A key clue is that your skin will have a reddish hue. This is caused by the CO displacing the oxygen in your blood stream. Your blood gets darker and is reflected in skin color.

Laconia Fire Department has portable CO detectors in most of our fire trucks and ambulances, as do most area fire departments. We use these devices to help locate the source of the CO. We can also test your blood to determine if you have high levels of CO in the blood stream. Remember that at anytime you suspect a fire, or you need our help for any emergency do not hesitate to call 911. Do not call the landlord, the furnace repair person, the gas company, your friends or family – call the Fire Department. It is extremely important that we be notified as soon as possible of any emergency so that we can effectively deal with it. Time is probably the most critical element in an emergency response.
