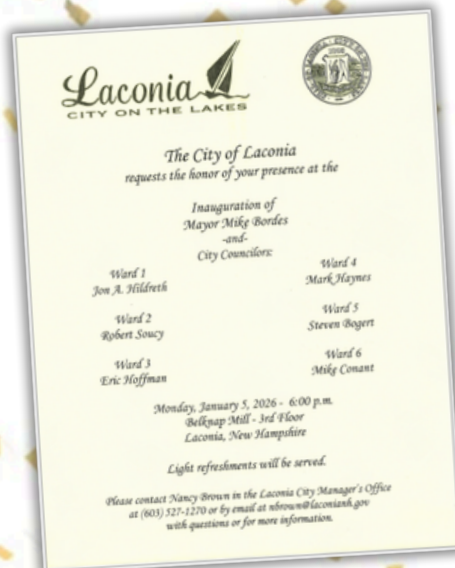

**We need your help!**

If you're able, please shovel out the fire hydrants close to your home or business. In a fire seconds count! Remember to clear a 3 foot perimeter round the hydrant, especially towards the street. Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work.

A common question that is asked is why do I need to clear the hydrant, won't the fire department clear the hydrant? The answer is yes, they will as soon as they can. However the fire department still has to respond to emergency calls. The City of Laconia has over 600 hydrants to clear and we could really use your help!

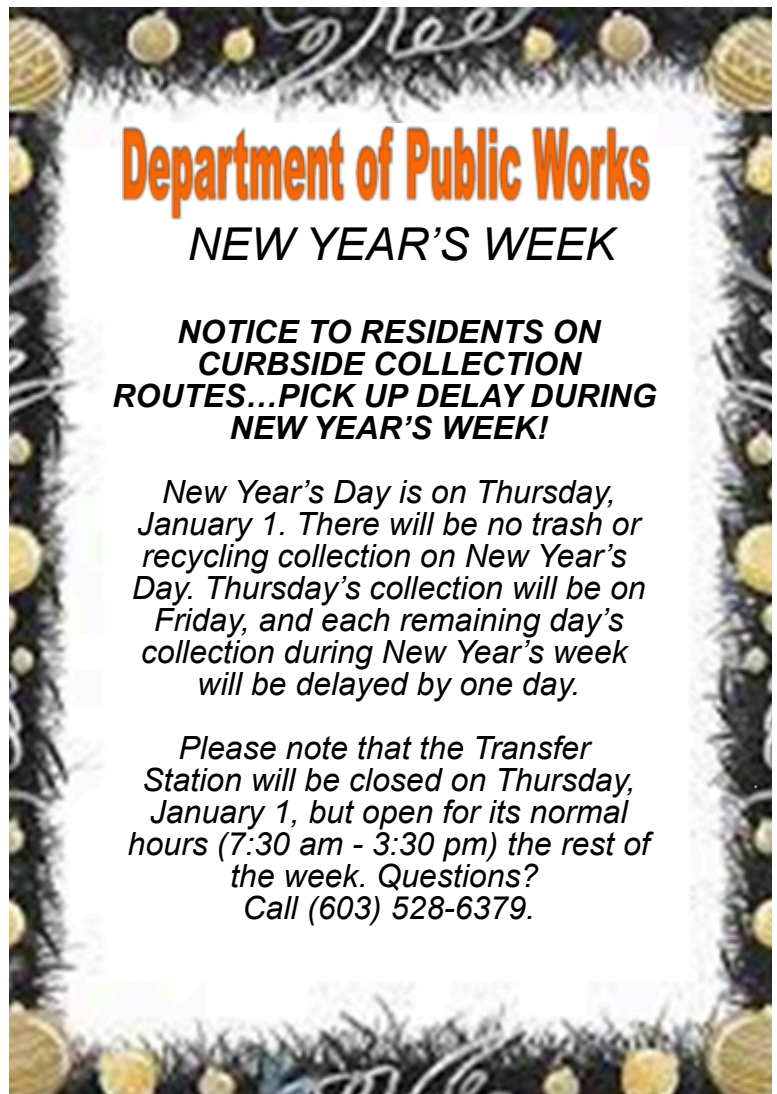
## Dementia Caregiver Support Group

## Laconia Historical & Museum Society – Presentation: History of the Laconia State School

A presentation by Lily Lescarbeau on the History of the Laconia State School will be presented on Wednesday, January 14th, at 6:00 p.m. at the Laconia Public Library.

A lifelong resident of Laconia, Lily attended Laconia High School and is currently studying history and legal studies at Saint Anselm College in Manchester. A self-proclaimed history enthusiast, she earned a Diploma of Distinction for her project on Laconia High School's history during its 100th anniversary in her senior year.

Lily was the first recipient of the Laconia Historical & Museum Society's Warren D. Huse Honorary Membership in 2024 and has since been an active member of the Society's Collections Team. During her senior year, she has spent countless hours studying and understanding the history of the Laconia State School.

The Laconia State School was opened in 1901, consisting of a dorm for the children and the superintendent's house. Over the years until the School's eventual closure in 1991, many buildings were built and torn down. The current property has sixteen buildings as well as numerous outbuildings used for the farm. There have been 8 superintendents over the 90 years the State School was active; Benjamin Ward Baker was superintendent for 35 years of that 90. The State School has a very rich history that while not showcased much and not well documented, is very important to share.

This program is free and open to the community as part of the Laconia Historical & Museum Society's 'Our Yesterdays 2026 Presentation Series.' 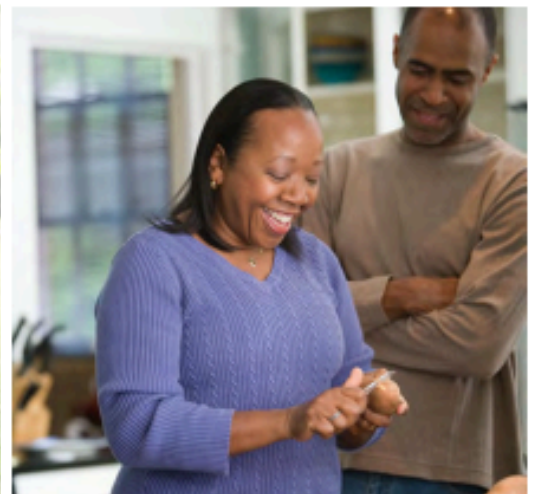

# Our Yesterdays

*Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past...*

## THEN ...

Bank Square, Laconia, is seen in winter, around 1910. Turret of Moulton Opera House Block, built in 1887, is seen at left. Eagle Hotel, with 1908 piazza on Main Street side, is at center, with 1898 Cook Block just beyond it. Tall steeple at right is that of Unitarian Church, built in 1868. A trolley car of the Laconia Street Railway heads into the square from Pleasant Street. The tracks had been rerouted from Main Street to Pleasant in 1898, when the line was electrified and the larger cars could not negotiate the 90-degree turn at the Church Street corner. Horses and sleighs also provide transportation. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

The Unitarian Church burned in 1938 and was replaced by a First National grocery store (now occupied by Citizens Bank). The Eagle Hotel was torn down in 1937 to make way for a Woolworth store — later occupied by Benjamin's, then the Sundial Shop and, today, by several stores and businesses. The Moulton Opera House Block and the other buildings on both sides of Main Street were razed during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s.
