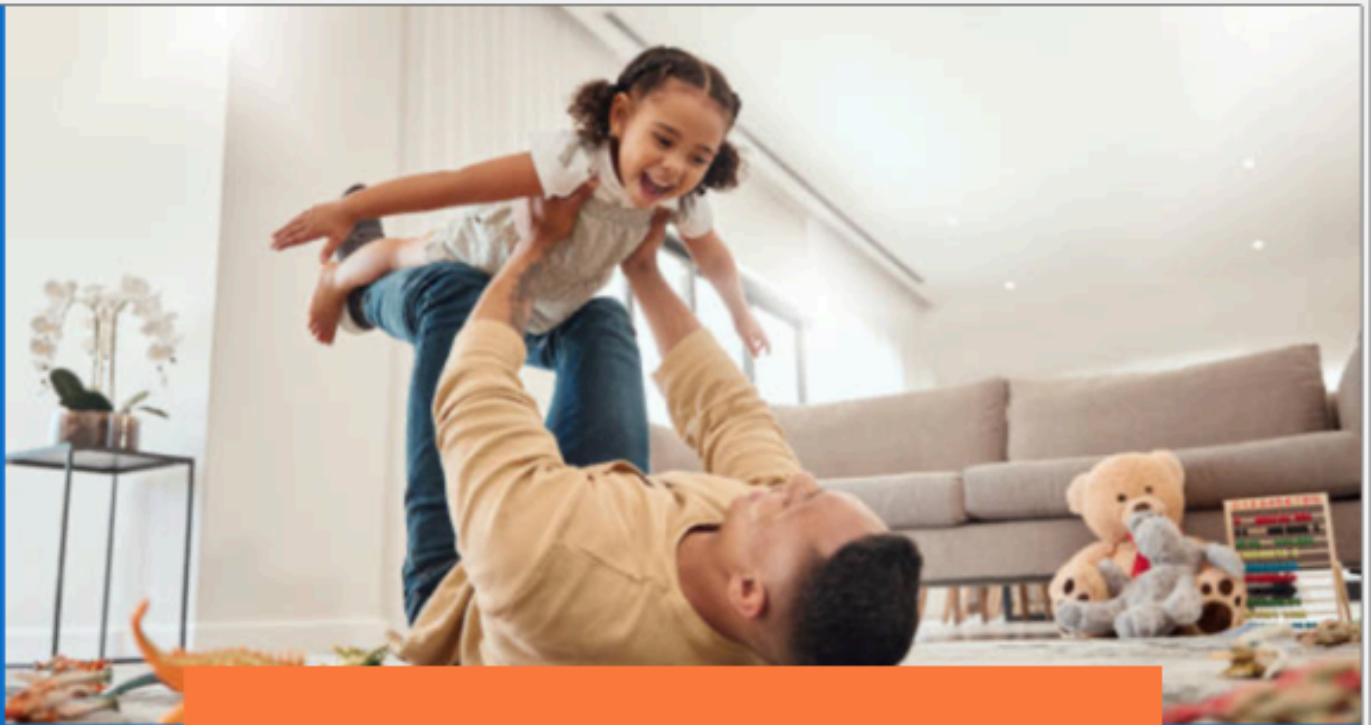
Dementia Caregiver Support Group

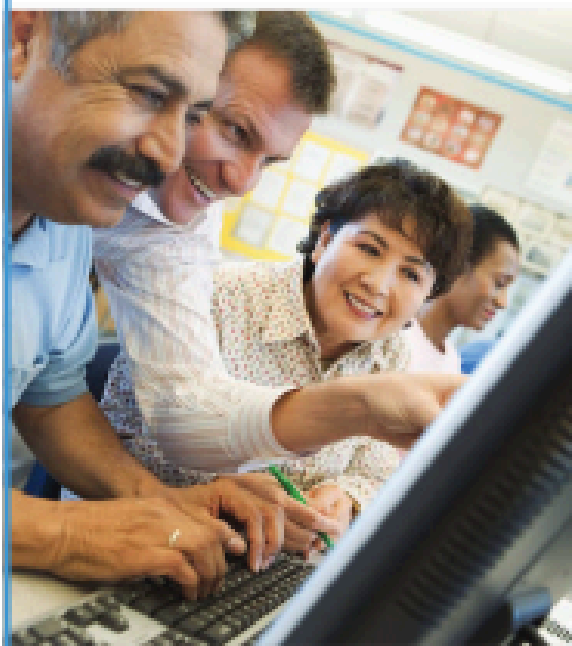

OVERVIEW

- A series of arctic fronts will bring a threat for snow squalls and an extended period of dangerous wind chills.

TIMING

- Snow Squalls are possible Thursday and Friday and may occur during evening commute times.
- An extended period of dangerous wind chills begins Thursday night lasting into next week.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Isolated but briefly heavy snow showers or squalls may impact commutes both Thursday and Friday evening with gusty winds and low visibilities.
- An [Extreme Cold Watch](#) has been issued for Northern New Hampshire and the Western Maine Mountains for Friday night into Saturday morning.
- Wind chills as low as 35 below zero can cause frostbite in as little as 10 minutes.
- We continue to monitor trends of a system that could bring a cold dry plowable snow to at least a portion of the area in the late Sunday/Monday time frame.

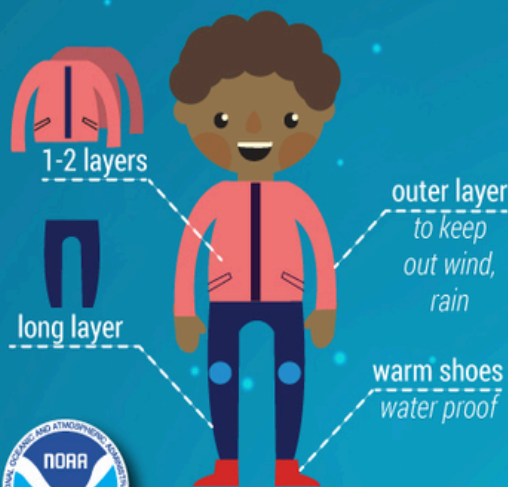

**Laconia Residents....
It's time to
register your dog!**

Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license.

The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times.

Please remember that a valid rabies certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register.

For a complete list of statutes pertaining to licensing your dog, please visit the [Chapter 466 Dogs and Cats page](#).

All dogs need to be registered by April 30th of each year.



We are happy to help register your dog in person here in City Hall or you can use our on-line registration. Just click the image (left). When processing your registration online, please be sure to add the two or three digit prefix (25 - or VET-.)

For the comfort and safety of all, we ask that you leave your dog at home when you come into City Hall to conduct business.

Although we love seeing your four-legged family members, we would like to encourage you to be conscious of others.

As always, certified service animals are welcome.

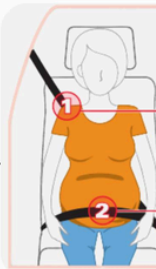

THEN ...

The Laconia Rod & Gun Club, on Beacon Street, Laconia, is seen in December 1956. The Queen Ann Victorian had earlier been home to the Wilkinson Funeral Home for many years before being acquired by the Rod & Gun Club, in January 1951 — 75 years ago this week. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Rod & Gun Club relocated to South Main Street when a 1957 parking lot project razed all of the buildings between the Post Office Parking Lot and the Busiel Mill. The brick storefront at right — home, for many years, to the Telephone Co. Business Office and later to Norman Weeks' Belknap Agency — was later occupied by Awakenings Espresso Cafe and, now, Trillium. Canal Street is just beyond that building and the Perley Canal just beyond that, under the buildings on the south side of Canal Street. Prior to 1907, when the canal was encased in concrete, it ran under a bridge on Beacon Street. In both photos, the Laconia Post Office is off-photo at left. (Gabriel Perry/The Laconia Daily Sun)

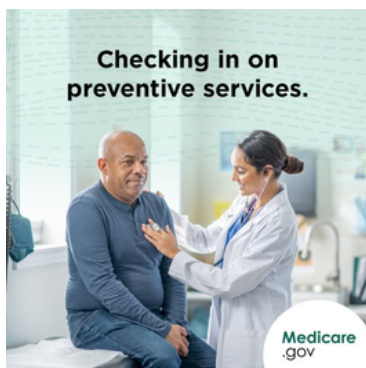
