

New Hampshire does not have a bare roads policy; snow-covered roads are a reality, even after plows have been through.

During a snow event, you can expect reduced visibility, longer travel times, and slick conditions. Stopping distances increase dramatically - at just 30 mph, it can take 100 feet (six car lengths) to stop.

Four-wheel drive won't help you stop faster or maintain control once you lose traction.

During a bad winter storm, if you don't have to travel, stay off the roads and allow plow crews to do their job. If you must be out, slow down, allow extra time, drive for the conditions, and check newengland511.org for real time traffic updates.

DOG LICENSES AVAILABLE

**Laconia Residents....
It's time to register your dog!**

Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license. The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times. Please remember that a valid rabies certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register.



We are happy to help register your dog in person here in City Hall or you can use our on-line registration. Just click the image (left). When processing your registration online, please be sure to add the two or three digit prefix (25 - or VET-.)

For a complete list of statutes pertaining to licensing your dog, please visit the [Chapter 466 Dogs and Cats page](#).

All dogs need to be registered by April 30 each year.

For the comfort and safety of all, we ask that you leave your dog at home when you come into City Hall to conduct business. Although we love seeing your four-legged family members, we would like to encourage you to be conscious of others. As always, certified service animals are welcome.



Smith, was occupied for a time by The Laconia Democrat, a weekly newspaper acquired by The Citizen in 1933, and portions of the structure were later occupied by The Citizen for its newsroom.
