### **An Evening of Frost with Stephen Collins Tuesday, February 9 at 7:00 p.m.**

An Evening of Frost is a unique, interactive performance that begins with a short biographical introduction into the poet's life. Robert Frost is greatly misunderstood. Certain people, some academics and politicians included, have tried to pigeonhole him, however the man is far more complicated than the surface indicates. This is, after all, a man who voted for Eugene Debs, one of the best known Socialists of the United States, but was vehemently opposed to Franklin Roosevelt and "The New Deal". It is this man that is seen in his poems that are often dialectic between chaos and order.

As part of the performance, an open discussion of the following poems will include:

"A Tuft of Flowers", "Mending Wall", "Birches", "After Apple Picking", "Acquainted with the Night" and "Desert Places"

Stephen is hoping that people will come having read these poems, willing to discuss them.

The performance closes with a dramatic reading of Frost's masterful use of blank verse in the hauntingly memorable "The Death of the Hired Man". Admission is free!

**186:11 Duties of State Board of Education.** – The state Board of Education shall, in addition to the duties assigned by RSA 21-N:11:IX-d. Require school districts to adopt a policy governing the administration of non-academic surveys or questionnaires to students. The policy shall require school districts to notify a parent or legal guardian of a non-academic survey or questionnaire and its purpose. The school district shall make such surveys or questionnaires available, at the school and on the school or school district's website, for review by a student's parent or legal guardian at least 10 days prior to distribution to students. The policy shall also allow a parent or legal guardian to opt out of the non-academic survey or questionnaire either in writing or electronically. In this paragraph, "non-academic survey or questionnaire" means surveys, questionnaires, or other documents designed to elicit information about a student's social behavior, family life, religion, politics, sexual orientation, sexual activity, drug use, or any other information not related to a student's academics. Parents/Guardians have the opportunity to opt out of their child(ren) participating in this process. **Please feel free to contact your school's Afterschool Site Coordinator if you choose to opt out or if you have any questions.**

## How would YOU Re-Imagine Laconia?

Did you attend the Re-Imagine Laconia Design Charrette this past August, the Open House in March of last year, or the Community Forum in October of 2014? Have you shared your ideas with Re-Imagine Laconia through our coasters found around town, or perhaps on our Facebook page, Instagram, or Twitter? Maybe you took a survey on our website? Perhaps you had an in-person interview with a neighbor or member of our Team?

**Well, all of your hard work and input is shaping up into some really neat visions for the future of Laconia!**

### **The Plan NH report from the Re-Imagine Laconia Design Charrette is finally here!**

This report summarizes much of the work of the Charrette, which was in turn informed by the many, many outreach platforms and events we've engaged in leading up to the Charrette.

#### **Examples of the Team's recommendations included:**

- A focus on walking and biking infrastructure in the nodes of tourist area in the Weirs.
- Location of new buildings, along Endicott North with setbacks from the street or wide sidewalks to allow Motorcycle Week vendors to co-locate with new development.
- In lieu of new development along that same corridor, the installation of porticos or canopies or solar arrays that could act as sun cover/rain cover for parking, vending or recreations sites (such as an ice rink).
- Growth of tourist based business such as hotels, small grocery or deli, coffee shops and bike or motor scooter rentals.
- Historic overlay district in the Weirs and potential form based codes or protects and perpetuate the tourist heritage.
- Updates to the Downtown Parking Garage to add aesthetics, signage and erase the perceptions regarding safety.
- Traffic calming on Beacon St. East, including pedestrian scale lighting and plantings.
- Traffic realignment on Beacon St. West, particularly at Veteran's square to erase driver confusion, reduce speeds and enhance pedestrian safety.
- Consider listing buildings in the National Register, which adds no restrictions but allows access to federal Historic Tax Credits and grants programs for rehab and restoration projects.

The report can be found in its entirety on the Re-Imagine Laconia Website ([www.reimagineLaconia.org](http://www.reimagineLaconia.org)) and will be presented at forums and meetings across the City in the coming weeks. Check back for dates and times! Your input is still needed as feedback from the report will help inform the final Land Use chapter of the Master Plan.

The Laconia Human Relations Committee, in cooperation with the Laconia Public Library, will show the film, *Central Station* on February 1st at 6:30 pm. This is another in the International Film Series shown monthly from September through June at the Library.

Dora, a retired schoolteacher, has become embittered with life. She works at Rio de Janeiro's Central Station, writing letters for illiterate customers in order to make ends meet. She is often impatient with her customers and sometimes does not even mail the letters she writes. Some end up in a drawer or even torn up.

Josué is a poor 9-year-old boy who has never met his father, but hopes to do so. His mother sends letters to his father through Dora, saying that she hopes to reunite with him soon. When the mother is in a bus accident just outside the train station, Josué is left alone.

Dora is initially reluctant to be responsible for the boy, but finally takes him in. However, the relationship is a difficult one on both sides. Both are set in their ways, leading to conflict, distrust, and hilarity. The question is, will Josué find his father?

The movie is set in Rio de Janeiro and Northeast Brazil. It has won many international awards including the 1999 Golden Globe Award and the 1998 Sundance Film Festival Best Screen Play Award. Make sure that you check the International Film Shelf at the Laconia Library for films shown over the past several years in this series. You can always order films from this International Film Series through your own library if you do not live in Laconia!
