

## LEEF Grant Winners

Congratulations to our newest Laconia Endowment Educational Foundation (LEEF) Grant Winners. LEEF offers grants to certified staff who wish to provide enrichment learning experiences/activities to their students. These grants will provide students the opportunity for learning experiences not otherwise available given budgetary constraints. LEEF is providing four grants to the Laconia School District. The Fall 2015 Award recipients are Christine Cook and Leigh Buliung at the Laconia High School, Andrea Besegai, Kelsey Marvin and Liz Weeks from Elm Street School, Joe Sampson and Jody Tierney of Woodland Heights School and Kelsea Forsberg and Aja Montague of Elm Street School. Joan Leroux and Carole Davis, LEEF Board Members, presented grantees with their awards on Friday, January 15, 2016 at their respective schools.



Christine Cook and Leigh Buliung will be able to provide Life Skills students with an Apple TV in their classroom. This will allow all teachers to present educational applications used on an iPad in a large format so the entire class can participate and be active, engaged learners. They will be awarded \$330.00 for the cost of the Apple TV, set up and educational applications.

Andrea Besegai, Kelsey Marvin and Liz Weeks will be provided \$458.00 to purchase iPads and to offer kindergarten students use of iPads during small group instruction, this provides hands on learning through the use of technology on a daily basis.



Joe Sampson and Jody Tierney will be provided \$458.00 to purchase iPads to engage kindergarten students during small group instruction. Students will use iPads loaded with age appropriate applications as a tool for learning early literacy and early numeracy.

Kelsea Forsberg and Aja Montague will be provided \$499.95 to purchase Cubelets. Cubelets are magnetic, electric robot blocks that will allow students to participate in STEM centered activities. Through hands on learning, students will build, troubleshoot and revise their plans and ideas in order to become more complex problem solvers.

## Celebrating the Seasons Series

**\$10 (\$8 Members) per session**

The natural world is constantly changing. If you take the time to look, each month brings new and exciting phenomena to learn from and delight in. Using author Mary Holland's book *Naturally Curious* as a month-by-month guide to the wonders unfolding in the fields, forests and wetlands of New England, each month participants will go on a leisurely hike with one of Prescott Farm's naturalists, with the goal of cultivating their observation skills and deepening each person's relationship with the natural world. *Note: Program titles and descriptions are used with permission from Mary Holland.*

### "Endurance"

**Saturday, January 9; 10-11:30 (Adults only); 1-2:30 (Families)**

**Wednesday, January 13; 1-2:30 (Homeschoolers ages 8-12)**

Although January occasionally provides us with a thaw, most years New England is locked into winter during this month. Food is scarce for wildlife and any snow on the ground usually compounds the difficulty of finding it.

### "Survival"

**Saturday, February 6; 10-11:30 (Adults only); 1-2:30 (Families)**

**Wednesday, February 10; 1-2:30 (Homeschoolers ages 8-12)**

February is a complex month—at the same time that many creatures are fighting for survival, others are bringing progeny into the world. The sun is stronger, the days longer. Even in northern New England the stirrings of spring have begun, albeit often under several feet of snow.

### "Awakening"

**SUNDAY\*, March 13; 10-11:30 (Adults only); 1-2:30 (Families)**

**Wednesday, March 9; 1-2:30 (Homeschoolers ages 8-12)**

For several centuries the British parted ways with the Gregorian calendar and declared March 25 the first day of the New Year. This makes enormous sense to most natural historians, for March is the month of "awakenings," when the earth begins to thaw and life begins to stir after months of relative inactivity. *March* is synonymous with rebirth—a new beginning for all living things.

*\*Please note: This month's program is on a Sunday as our Maple Sugaring programs are running on Saturdays in March.*

Depending on the weather, the week will be a mix of: Animal tracking and snowshoeing adventures, sledding, winter games such as "Weasels & Voles," building "quinzees" or igloos, a Winter Quest, exploring the frozen pond, winter-themed art & craft projects, maple sugaring, and stories around the campfire. 



### Eight Tips For Shoveling Snow Safely from Laconia Parks & Recreation

Shoveling snow is hard work, stay safe!

**Keep up with the storm.** The recommendation is to clear the snow every few inches so it is not too heavy.

**Push don't lift.** Pushing the snow exerts less stress on your body, but if you must lift be sure to use your legs not your back.

**Wear Breathable layers.** You want to wear layers so if you get too hot you can remove one. Keep the sweat away from your body as much as possible.

**Wear good waterproof gloves and boots.** Make sure your boots have good traction so you don't slip and fall.

**Stay hydrated.** Drink water like you are working out, because you are!

**Stretch.** If you stretch before you shovel you will help prevent injury and fatigue.

**Keep your phone with you.** If you have your phone you are able to make a call in event of an emergency.

**Pay close attention to your surroundings.** When close to the road stay vigilant of the traffic. Stay out of their way as vehicles don't have the traction to stop quickly in snowy and icy conditions.
