

## INFORMATIONAL MEETING

### City Unveils Main Street Bridge Website

The City is ready to begin construction to replace the 40 year old bridge that crosses the Winnipesaukee River at the South end of Downtown. The contractor, R.M. Piper, has already begun preliminary construction set-up including moving in a construction trailer and preparing a storage area and detour signage. Construction itself is slated to begin "on or around" Monday, March 31st.

As part of the Phase I of construction, Beacon Street East will be closed. All northbound traffic will be detoured down Main St. Those looking to access City Hall, the Laconia Parking Garage or other businesses/offices on Beacon St. East will be directed to Hanover Street in order to re-connect with Beacon St. Maps showing Phase I construction and detours are available from a link on the City's home page.





## **HOW MANY CALORIES SHOULD MY CHILD HAVE DAILY?**

I've been asked numerous times "How many calories should my child be eating per day?" This will vary based on the child's activity level. Here are some general guidelines to help you assess whether or not your child is taking in too many or too few calories per day. If you have questions about your child's weight contact your family physician and seek help from a Nutrition Specialist. Elizabeth White with Health-firstfamily.org has started a Teen Weight Loss Support Group and Lakes Region Family Resource Center (524-8811) has been offering Cooking Matters classes for families. The course offers Nutrition Education provided by UNH Cooperative Extension along with cooking skills, dinner and food for home.

## What are Complete Streets?



Complete Streets are streets for everyone, no matter who they are or how they travel.



The City of Laconia strives to incorporate elements of complete streets into not only the review of private construction projects but into our own public projects as well. Questions? Please contact the Planning Department at 527-1264.

What is a Complete Street? A complete street is a street design that accommodates not only cars but all other modes of transportation including public transportation, biking and walking. A street also takes into account all types of users from the very young to the very old and everyone in between. What this means is streets designed with adequate paved shoulders, bus stops, bike lanes, safe sidewalk and pedestrian street crossings and proper signage. The design incorporates bike lanes, ramps for sidewalks, both visual and audio cues for pedestrian crossings, and traffic calming devices adjacent to pedestrian areas to slow traffic down making a safer environment for the pedestrian.


