
March 28th "Thirsty Tuesday" Conversation at 405 Pub & Grill



CELEBRATE LACONIA ANNOUNCES DETAILS OF 125TH ANNIVERSARY EVENTS, INTRODUCES BOARD, AND UNVEILS BRANDING BY LOCAL FIRM

Celebrate Laconia, a group of local citizen volunteers, unveiled plans last week to mark Laconia's 125th anniversary celebration in 2018, unveiled its branding and introduced the group's Board of Directors. The organization will carry out plans for a parade, a festival, fireworks and other events to take place over more than a year.

The news came March 16 at the Taylor Community, where Celebrate Laconia President Pamela Clark – who helped organize Laconia's 75th and 100th anniversary celebrations -- introduced Board members planning the celebration to honor the traditions, heritage and culture that have made Laconia special.

The anniversary celebrations will begin August 19, 2017 with a recognition of the 125th anniversary of the Laconia Passenger Station's construction.


Clark, President of the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, introduced Board members Vice President Samantha Jewett, an Attorney with Haughey, Philpot & Laurent, PA; Treasurer/Finance Director Alexandra MacDonald, Senior Bank Service Representative at Bank of New Hampshire; Secretary Beth San Soucie, Program Manager at Stay Work Play New Hampshire; Parades Director Chester Cilley, who has worked on many City events, including Fourth of July festivities; Publicity Director Jared Guilmett, Architectural Staff Designer at Misiaszek Turpin PLLC; Entertainment Director Becky Guyer, owner of BG Costumes; and Historical Director Brenda Kean, Director of Resident Life at the Taylor Community.

Board members also discussed the group's branding and logo, designed by JMG Marketing of Laconia, which depicts in blue on a white background local landmarks, such as the Laconia Public Library, the Belknap Mill, and the Congregational Church of Laconia. The line of iconic structures, flanked by the Weirs Beach sign above the words "Celebrate Laconia," aims to evoke and promote vitality and a sense of civic pride. The group plans to partner with public officials and members of civic and nonprofit organizations to continue this work beyond 2018.

In addition to a parade, a festival, and fireworks, the group is planning many other activities, including publishing a book on Laconia's history and a booklet promoting Citywide celebratory events and hosting a birthday celebration March 24, 2018 – the date of Laconia's incorporation in 1893. There will also be a July celebration that will occur the weekend after Independence Day, on July 7-8, and other activities to be announced.

UNH Cooperative Extension Internship Opportunity Belknap County 4-H & Agriculture Program Summer 2017

This 10-week summer internship opportunity will provide an undergraduate student the chance to work on two projects in Belknap County relating to education in healthy living and local food promotion. This position is 25 hours per week, split between the two projects:

Belknap County 4-H Project in Healthy Living Education:

Working under the guidance of the Belknap County 4-H Program Coordinator, the successful candidate will recruit volunteers, foster collaborative relationships, organize & execute Special Interest (SPIN) youth programs on any number of healthy living program areas. One example might be 'Healthy Harvest - shopping and cooking from the Farmer's Market'. Potential collaborators might include local farmer's markets, Belknap County Master Gardeners, local health food stores, and/or Lakes Region General Hospital.

Belknap County Agriculture, Local Food Guide:

The Food & Agriculture project will involve work on the 2018 edition of the Lakes Region Local Food Guide. Duties and responsibilities of the Intern will include, 1) travel to local farmers markets, farm stands, pick-your-own farms to take photographs which will be used in the 2018 Lakes Region Local Food Guide; 2) work with staff to develop a series of short, educational articles through interviews and research, that help inform the consumer about how to purchase and support local, healthy food. These articles will be published in the food guide.

Who should apply?

Undergraduate students enrolled in a related degree program, with an interest in education, communications, and/or photography. Special consideration will be given to students of UNH and USNH colleges/universities.

Requirements:

- Must have a valid driver's license, and reliable transportation. Some travel will be required for which the candidate will receive a travel reimbursement.
- Ability to work with youth and adults
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Present the internship experience to the Belknap County Extension Advisory Council at an evening meeting in Fall 2017 as well as other public relations venues during the course of the internship.

This position will be based in the Belknap County Extension Office in Laconia, and will pay a rate of \$10 per hour. The internship begins approx. June 5, and will end August 13, 2017.
