During the weeks of May 9th and May 23rd, the City's solid waste contractor (Casella Waste) will pick up an additional 10 bags of leaves/yard waste during these 2 weeks – on your normal trash day. Please note that yard waste will be collected by a separate truck **NOT** the normal trash collection truck.

All materials must be placed in paper compostable bags. Please place bagged yard waste at least 3 feet away from your trash.

Hands on Summer Learning at the Huot Technical Center!

A limited number of seats are still available in Huot Technical Center's summer programming for 7th and 8th grade students. This year the regional technical school will once again be offering a **Construction Camp** for middle school students featuring a wide variety of hands-on learning activities. **Construction Camp** runs June 20th-24th and is lead by HTC instructor, Mike Schofield. Students will learn basic skills related to carpentry, plumbing, electrical and other aspects of the building trades.

This year, the Huot is also launching a new **Girls' Technology Camp**. The focus of this week-long camp is to encourage more girls to consider **STEM** related careers. **Girls' Technology Camp** will run the week of June 27th-July 1st and is led by Pre-Engineering instructor Ken Martin. 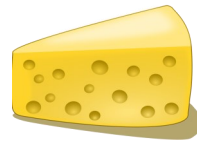

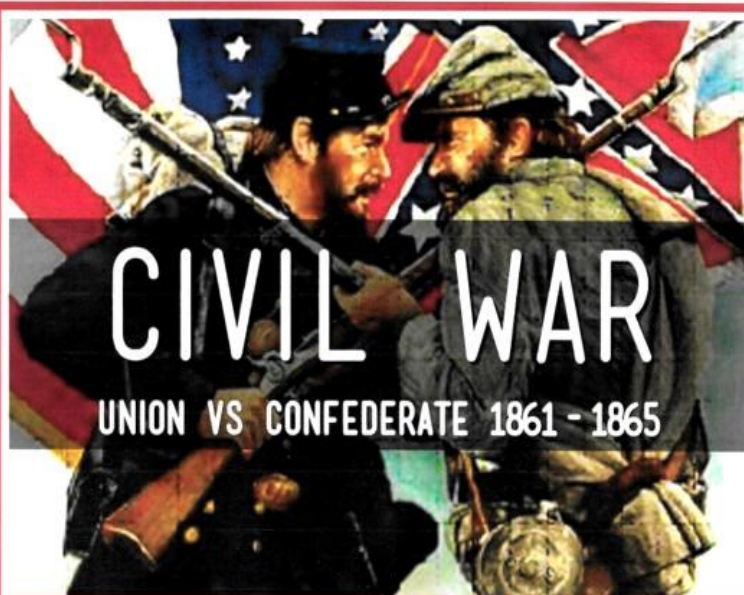
If you need help this summer, this program is designed for you.

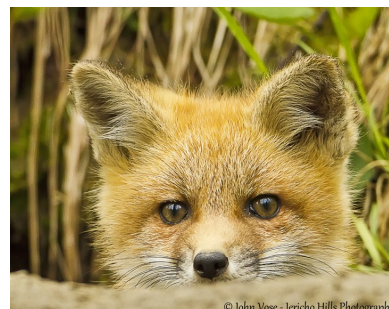

May 13th is the last day to sign up to play softball for our Senior Division teams. To play for LRGS, girls must be between the ages of 13 and 18 (as of Dec. 31, 2015). Our Senior Division is open to players from all around Central NH & the Lakes Region.

Senior Division Frequently Asked Questions:

- **How long is the season?** Approximately 6-8 weeks. Practices will start mid-late May, and end in early July. LRGS does not schedule events Memorial Day Weekend or on the 4th of July.
- **Will it interfere with school softball?** No. While we may have a few practices, our game schedule won't start until the school season is over.
- **Where will practices/games take place?** LRGS will use fields in Belmont, Gilford, & Laconia for practices & home games. Teams will travel for away games (locations to be determined).
- **What is the commitment level?** Typically 2-3 events per week. The schedule is a work in progress and subject to change.
- **What if I play another sport, have a part time job or have a vacation planned?** No problem! Game and practice schedules are handed out early in the season to give players and families a chance to review for any conflicts. If there are conflicts, players should let their coaches know as soon as possible.
- **What does it cost to play?** The registration fee is \$75 per player (family discount available). Players are also asked to participate in the league fundraiser. Uniforms are provided for that fee.
