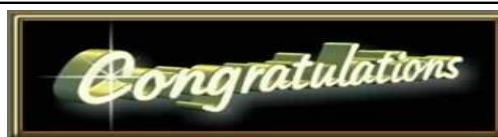

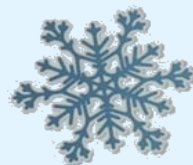

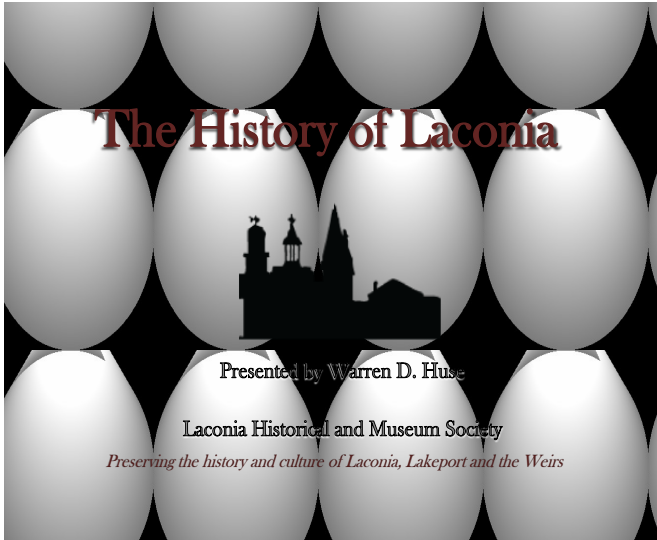
## Winter Parking Ban!

## **RECYCLING TOTER** **PROGRAM**

The City of Laconia Department of Public Works is offering commercial grade 2-wheeled 64-gal. recycling containers with a hinged lid for sale as part of the City's curbside recycling program. There are 1,000 toters available on a first-come/first-serve basis. The cost for one (1) toter is \$25, with the City supporting \$20 of the program cost. Additional toters are available at \$45 each - while supplies last. Anticipated delivery is during November 2012.

The Laconia Parks and Recreation and Public Works Departments would like to extend an invitation to the public to attend a presentation of the recently completed sand migration study on Thursday, November 29<sup>th</sup>, at the Weirs Community Center at 6:30pm.

The study was initiated in response to growing concerns about the erosion of the beach area, which has seen a significant reduction in size since its installation in the 1950's. The consultant who performed the study, Woods Hole Group, will use the results of the study to make recommendations on how the beach can be restored along with methods on how to limit erosion.

# *Assessing*

In a recent *Laconia Links* we provided you with definitions of some jargon commonly used by Planners. In this edition, we've listed some terms commonly heard in an Assessing Office, along with their simpler definitions:

**Assessed Value**- The value of property based on qualified fair market sales of a certain time period by means of mass appraisal.

**Appraised Value**- The value of property based on market value.

**Mass Appraisal**- The process of valuing a *group* of properties as of a given date (April 1<sup>st</sup> in NH).

**Equalization Rate**- A percentage that indicates how assessed values relate to market value.

**Qualified Sale**- A fair market sale between a willing buyer and a willing seller, listed on the open market. (Excludes such things as family transactions, foreclosures, private sales, etc.)

**Deed**- A document recorded at the County Registry of Deeds transferring ownership or interest to a property.

**Grantor**- The seller of a property.

**Grantee**- The purchaser of a property.

**Owner**- The person(s) or entity having deeded interest to a property.

**Easement**- Typically a deeded right to cross over another's property.

**Improved Land**- Land containing a structure.

**Current Use**- Was established to preserve agricultural and forest land by lowering the valuation. It is available to qualifying parcels with a minimum of 10 acres of undeveloped land.

**Land Use Change Tax**- A tax issued when Current Use property is developed or changes and no longer qualifies for Current Use.

**Tax Year**- Runs April 1<sup>st</sup> thru March 31<sup>st</sup>. It is not the calendar year.

**First Half Tax Bill**- Refers to the "Spring" bill usually mailed in June. It is considered a pre-payment for the tax year and (pending any changes to the property) is based on half of the prior year's total.

**Final Tax Bill** (Second Half Bill)- Refers to the "Fall" bill usually mailed in November. This bill calculates the total due for the tax year based on the new assessed value and the new tax rate. It will deduct the amount paid on the First Half Bill.

**Abatement**- Typically refers to an appeal of an assessed value. Available after the final tax bills have been mailed until March 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Exemption**- Is a dollar amount deducted from the assessed value for qualifying applicants. (Example: Elderly Exemption)

**Credit**- Is a dollar amount deducted from the tax amount for qualifying applicants. (Example: Veteran's Credit)

**Tax Map**- Maps showing boundary lines and sizes of parcels based on recorded information, such as deeds, surveys, or plans.

**Map ID Number** (Map & Lot)- A series of numbers (typically 3 or 4) depicting the location of each parcel on the tax maps. MBLU= Map-Block-Lot-Unit
