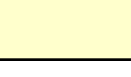

Laconia Fire Department issues warning about turkey fryers



Over the past decade there has been a new trend for cooking turkeys - the turkey fryer. The traditional method of cooking a turkey could take hours; a turkey fryer can complete the job in less than an hour. Unfortunately, every year deep fat fryers are responsible for many fires and injuries. As the fryers become more common the fires and deaths will continue to increase. Because of the risks attributed to turkey fryers, Underwriters Laboratories will not certify any fryer with their trusted UL mark and many safety organizations warn against their use. The majority of reported incidents occurred while the oil was being heated, prior to adding the turkey. For this reason, it is very important that consumers monitor the temperature of the oil

closely. If any smoke at all is noticed coming from a heating pot of oil, the burner should be turned off immediately because the oil is overheated. A flash fire can occur very quickly at this point.

Should you choose to fry turkeys follow these safety guidelines:

Turkey fryers are not meant to be used indoors.

Keep the fryer in FULL VIEW while burner is on.

Do not let children get anywhere near the fryer.

Place the fryer in an open area AWAY from all walls, fences, or other structures.

Never use IN, ON, or UNDER a garage, breezeway, carport, porch, or any structure that can catch fire.

Raise and lower food SLOWLY to reduce splatter and avoid burns.

COVER bare skin when adding or removing food.

Check the oil temperature frequently.

If oil begins to smoke, immediately turn gas supply OFF.

If a fire occurs, immediately call 911.

DO NOT extinguish fire with water.

Follow these guidelines as you prepare to use a turkey fryer:

- ▶ Make sure there is at least 2 feet of space between the liquid propane tank and fryer burner.
- ▶ Place the liquid propane gas tank and fryer so that any wind blows the heat of the fryer away from the gas tank.
- ▶ Center the pot over the burner on the cooker.
- ▶ Completely thaw (USDA says 24 hours for every 4 to 5 pounds) and dry turkey before cooking. Partially frozen and/or wet turkeys can produce excessive hot oil splatter when added to the oil.
- ▶ Follow the manufacturer's instructions to determine the proper amount of oil to add. If those are not available:
 - Place turkey in pot
 - Fill with water until the turkey is covered by about 1/2 inch of water
 - Remove and dry turkey
 - Mark water level. Dump water, dry the pot, and fill with oil to the marked level.

Remember: you are heating combustible oil to a very high temperature. There could easily be several gallons of oil in the fryer. If this ignites it will create a very serious fire and produce huge amounts of thick black smoke. I dealt with one of these fires about 15 years ago. It wasn't a Thanksgiving turkey, however the resulting fire destroyed the home's kitchen and left major damage to the rest of the home.

The Perfect Game recalls the feat of a Monterrey Little League Team in 1952. A seemingly impossible dream of playing baseball for the United States becomes a reality for a group of youngsters from an impoverished Mexican city in this poignant drama based on actual events.

César Faz moves to Monterrey, Mexico after he is let go by the St. Louis Cardinals from his job as a clubhouse attendant. There he meets local children enjoying baseball being led by Padre Esteban. He takes pitcher Angel Macías under his wing and brags about his own pitching skills and how he used to coach the Cardinals. Ángel convinces César to help recruit and coach Monterrey's first-ever Little League team. With César's skills and Padre Esteban's support, the boys hone themselves into a competitive team worthy of international competition.

When the team arrives in the United States, they are met with racism, a language barrier, and visa troubles. Though the underdogs, the team scores a series of victories that endear them to the media and new fans. They befriend a sports reporter, Frankie, and the groundskeeper, Cool Papa Bell, who then assist the boys in reaching the final game.

On behalf of the entire community and the City Council, Mayor Ed Engler of Laconia recently presented a Proclamation to Susan Legendre declaring that the City Council of Laconia designates the month of November 2015 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in Laconia, New Hampshire. Susan is a resident of Laconia and volunteers with the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network. She has visited almost every hospital in the state to raise awareness of the need for progress in developing treatments and early detection tools for pancreatic cancer.

To date, pancreatic cancer is the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States and is projected to become the second by 2020. It is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just seven percent. Approximately 200 deaths will occur in New Hampshire in 2015 from pancreatic cancer. Ten members play a total of 14 instruments.

The singers in this Chorale have performed in 14 different states and in 29 foreign countries.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

The course is designed for adults who regularly interact with adolescents (teachers, school staff, coaches, youth group leaders, parents, bus drivers, etc.). In January 2013, President Obama recommended Youth Mental Health Training for all. The core Mental Health First Aid course has been successfully offered to more than 100,000 people across the USA, including hospital staff, employers and business leaders, faith communities, law enforcement, and the general public.

WHO: Community Members

WHAT: Youth Mental Health First Aid

WHEN: Tuesday, December 29, 2015 from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm

WHERE: Laconia School District Administrative Office Board Room
39 Harvard Street

COST: Free (Cost supported by the Project AWARE Grant) - Training limited to 25 participants - Snacks and Lunch provided

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS LEARN?

The course teaches participants the risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder. Participants do not learn to diagnose, nor how to provide any therapy or counseling – rather, participants learn to support a youth developing signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in an emotional crisis by applying a core five-step action plan:

- ~Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- ~Listen nonjudgmentally
- ~Give reassurance and information
- ~Encourage appropriate professional help
- ~Encourage self-help and other support strategies

The Youth Mental Health First Aid USA curriculum is primarily focused on information participants can use to help adolescents and transition-age youth, ages 12-18.
