From November 1st to May 1st no vehicle is allowed to be parked on a public street between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:30 a.m.

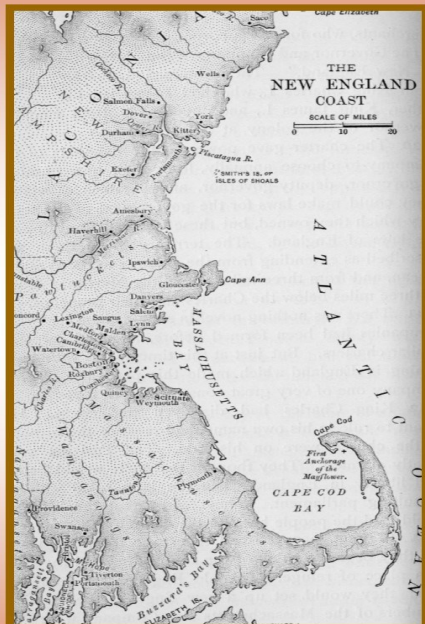
Winter Parking Ban!

Taylor Community Welcomes New Executive Director



Taylor's Board of Trustees Chair David Lynch announced the selection of Michael Flaherty as the new executive director of the well-known continuing care retirement community. "We are so pleased to have Michael on board to continue on the path of continuously providing the highest quality of retirement living options. Opechee Harbor, Taylor's state-of-the-art memory care unit, was opened and is at full occupancy. Give your children flashlights or glow sticks so they can see where they are going and drivers can see them. Look both ways before crossing a street.

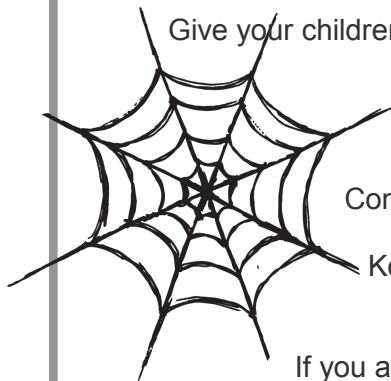
Keep decorations away from candles, light bulbs, or heaters.

Hiking the Lakes Region with Gordon Dubois

Hiking enthusiast Gordon Dubois will share his stories of hiking in the Lakes Region, at Taylor Community's Woodside Building, Monday, Nov. 2 at 6:30 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.

Dubois hails from up-state New York and spent many summers with his aunt and uncle who lived in the Adirondack Mountains. It was there he learned a love of the outdoors – hiking, swimming and fishing. He and his family moved to Laconia in 1977, but it wasn't until 1980 that he climbed his first 4,000 foot mountain – with his 9-year-old son. Ten years later he tried winter hiking with a trip up Mt. Hale and was hooked.



Gordon has hiked extensively in Northern New England and the Adirondacks of New York State. In 2011 he completed the Appalachian Trail (2,285 miles). He has also hiked the Long Trail in VT, The International AT in Quebec, Canada, Cohos Trail in northern NH and the John Muir Trail in CA. Gordon has summited the New Hampshire Hundred Highest peaks, and the New England Hundred Highest, 98 of these in winter. He spends much of his time hiking locally and in the White Mountains with his dog Reuben and especially enjoys hiking in the Lakes Region due to the proximity to his home in New Hampton. He is also a trail maintainer for the Belknap Range Trail Tenders (BRATTS) and can often be found exploring the many hiking trails in the area.

Using personal stories and photos from his adventures in the mountains around the Lakes Region, he will take you on the trails near his home. Come hear about his passion and maybe find one of your own!
