


HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

VEGETABLE PLANTING GUIDE

The information listed in this guide is meant to make gardening a rewarding pastime for all new gardeners. This guide will give you hints and tips on *when* is best to plant your garden. Please keep in mind that planting a garden takes a bit of planning and preparation and it is not always easy. You may feel overwhelmed at times, which is why this guide was made, to take some of your stresses away!

Your first step is to create your garden. Be sure it is in an area that gets full sun most of the day. Part of your planning process should be to get a soil sample and amend your soil according to the recommendations of the [UNH Cooperative Extension](#) who can help you with this.

Now for the fun part! Choose the vegetables that you like and purchase the seed packets. This is Important: you need to pay close attention to the information on the back of the seed packet. It will give you information on how to plant, when to plant, how often to water, when to harvest and the days to maturity. Keep the packets as a reference. The dates on the packet are averaged, the maturation date could be before or after the date given. Don't get discouraged, be patient!

A way to accelerate your garden's growth is to start your seeds growing inside. If this is something you are interested in, look at the information below or online to check the dates for starting your seeds and then transplanting them. There is a ton of information online for all your gardening needs, use it to your advantage.

The following information is provided by the National Gardening Association. For more information check out their website at <https://garden.org/>

It is better to start broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, lettuce and spinach indoors and then transplant them to the garden once the soil can be worked. They can also be direct seeded in your garden as the ground thaws.

Plant onion starts, potatoes and peas (sugar snap and English) as soon as the ground thaws.

Tomatoes, peppers and eggplant can be started indoors; then around May 4 you should start watching the weather forecast and as soon as there is no frost, go ahead and transplant the plants into the ground.

Beans, cowpeas, corn, squashes, pumpkins, cucumbers, watermelons, gourds and sunflowers can be started indoors now and the seedlings can be transplanted when there is no longer the danger of frost. You can also plant these seeds directly into the ground around May 8, or if your soil is still very cold, once the soil is near 60 degrees F in temperature."

GIANT SILK MOTH SPECIALIST, LUCY GOLDEN, GUEST SPEAKER FOR OPECHEE GARDEN CLUB

Opechee Garden Club is pleased to announce that on Monday, May 1, 2017, at 1 PM, at the Gilford Community Church, 19 Potter Hill Road in Gilford, guest speaker Lucy Golden, giant silk moth specialist and juried member of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, will present a power point program titled, "Giant Silk Moths in New Hampshire". Her program will include an overview of the four local/native species of giant silk moths, the new challenges facing them, how she and her family raise them, and finally, how she uses the hatched cocoons to make beautiful jewelry.

While Lucy has always had an avid interest in nature, and especially in insects, she narrowed her focus about nine years ago when she and her family noticed that there weren't nearly as many giant silk moth cocoons on their trees as there used to be. Upon researching the problem, Golden learned that it was the parasitic tachinid fly, a non-native, that was devastating the population of these beautiful and rare creatures. She looked for ways to help the moths and developed her own protocol for raising and protecting them. Lucy now gives presentations to garden clubs and other interested groups about the process of raising these huge magnificent moths, and gives extra cocoons and caterpillars to schools in the hope that the experience and information "spreads appreciation and awareness of both these incredible moths and the greater natural world."

Since Lucy and her family raise so many of the four types of giant silk moths, they end up with a lot of hatched cocoons. After learning of Native American and African tribal customs of using the hatched cocoons to make sacred rattles, Golden was inspired to do the same but added one more step, that of copper electroform to create jewelry. It seems that Lucy, who had a longtime interest in jewelry, attended jewelry making classes at the Rhode Island School of Design while she was earning a B.A. at Brown University. After graduating, she worked in the fashion jewelry industry in Manhattan, New York before moving permanently to Franconia, New Hampshire. She is a juried member of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, and has exhibited at their Sunapee Fair every August for 20 years. Her jewelry can be found in League of New Hampshire stores as well as other locations nationally.

Hospitality Chairs, Gail Dyer and Elaine Gagnon, and their Committee Lorraine Buccholz, Janice Combe, Linda Hudziec, Mary Lou LeBreton, Evelyn Millar, Florence Merrill, Judy Riley, Rebecca Ronstadt, Marnie Schulz, Iris Whitehorn, and Ann Woglom will provide refreshments and table décor. Members and their guests are encouraged to arrive early, 12:30 - 1:00 PM, to socialize before the Business Meeting begins at 1 PM.




