City of Laconia Hilliard Road Brush Dump



has been something he's always done. Come enjoy the stories and let Bob's combination of music and lyrics take you somewhere you may, or may not, have been before!


Learn About Advanced Care Directives April 5th at Taylor Community

Central New Hampshire VNA and Hospice has collaborated with Dr. Marianne Jackson to present a series of events entitled "What Ever Happened to Natural Causes? Historical Perspectives on Death and Dying Across 100 Years."

These events coincide with the organizations' Centennial Year Celebration and highlight Doctor Jackson's research regarding the changes in medicine over the past century; common myths and misconceptions, and why it is more important than ever before to plan for your future.

Doctor Jackson, who served as a physician in North Conway for 30 years, is now dedicating her time to help people avoid unnecessary end of life suffering. Sessions will be Wednesday, April 5 at 2 and 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Theater.

Wounded Warriors—A Soldier's Story of Healing Through Birds



Robert C. Vallieres struggled to find his "new normal" when he returned home after serving in the military. An accident in Kuwait left him suffering from traumatic brain injury (TBI) and internal injuries, leaving him in constant pain.

After clinics, bottles of painkillers, and behavior modification pills, hope seemed to vanish. Then a local weekly newspaper ad caught his eye: a bird-watching trip to see raptors in the mountains of New Hampshire. An Emily Dickinson poem that states, "Hope is the thing with feathers that perches in the soul, and sings the tune—without the words, and never stops at all," sprang to his mind.

Wounded Warriors is Vallieres' story of self-healing from crippling "invisible" wounds through the help of birds. His story of recovery offers a winged hope to thousands of military personnel who suffer these physical and mental battles. This inspiring presentation will take place Wednesday, April 12 at 6:30 p.m. at Taylor Community's Woodside Building. It is free and open to the public.

A growing tradition in the Lakes Region

OPECHEE GARDEN CLUB BEGINS 78TH YEAR OF ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

Opechee Garden Club, founded in Laconia, in 1939, will begin its 78th year with a Business Meeting and Speaker Presentation on Monday, April 3, 2017, at 1:00 PM at the Gilford Community Church, 19 Potter Hill Road, in the Village of Gilford, New Hampshire.

The guest speaker, Robert Gillmore, a nationally recognized landscape designer and author, will deliver a lecture program titled, "Large, Lush, Low Maintenance Gardens", which will be illustrated with color slides. He will explain how to create colorful, but low maintenance, gardens with trees, shrubs and ground covers. He will also discuss using natural-looking ridges, also known as "berms" to create privacy on one's property.

Robert Gillmore was born and raised in Claremont, New Hampshire, graduated cum laude from Williams College in Williamstown, Massachusetts, and received his Ph.D from the University of Virginia, in Charlottesville, Virginia, where he was a DuPont Fellow.

Gillmore has authored several books, and numerous "Great Walks" Guides. His first book, "The Wooded Garden", a Garden Book Club selection, was hailed by New York Times Garden Columnist Allen Lacy as "an excellent and much needed guide to building a low-maintenance, naturalistic garden in the woods." His next book was, "Beauty All Around You: How To Create Large, Private, Low- Maintenance Gardens, Even On Small Lots and Small Budgets". Both of these books will be available for purchase at the program.

Gillmore's best known landscape design garden is "Evergreen", his own one acre woodland garden in Goffstown, New Hampshire, which has been featured in both newspapers and gardening magazines, including the 1996 January/February issue of "Fine Gardening" magazine. "Evergreen" is open to the public every year, without charge, on the first weekend in June.

Another Gillmore garden design project, "Water's Edge", is a two acre residential garden on a three acre pond in Bedford, New Hampshire. This project was chosen for a nationwide program by the Garden Conservancy, which organizes tours of "exceptional" private residential gardens, to raise funds to restore and preserve outstanding non-profit gardens across the country.

Hospitality Co-Chairs, Barb Sargent and Ginger Jones, and their Committee, Maureen Bastille, Dick Christopher, Irene Fournier, Gayle Green, Trudy Hastings, Helen Hemeon, Joyce Howe, Esther Kratochvil, Maggie Martin, Gladys McCaughey, Patricia Moore and Eleanor Swain will provide refreshments and table décor, It is suggested that members and their guests arrive early, 12:30 - 1:00 PM to socialize before the Business Meeting begins.



Chocorua Lodge #51

Having earlier been postponed by severe winter weather, Chocorua Lodge 51 of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, as well as the Daughters of Rebekah, will present a discussion of their history and activities, at 7 p.m. Monday, April 17, in Rotary Hall on the Lower Level of the Laconia Public Library, under the auspices of the Laconia Historical and Museum Society.

Several members of this 300 year old fraternal organization, established at Lake Village (Lakeport) in 1844 and Laconia in 1869, will discuss their relief projects, educational foundation, their SOS Children's Village/Orphanage in Cambodia, Living Legacy of planting trees, The Arthritis Foundation, Visual Research Foundation, and the UN Pilgrimage for Youth.

Chocorua Lodge 51 (chartered in 1869) was combined with Winnipesaukee Lodge in the 1990s and remains the only active IOOF lodge in Belknap County. As one of 20 lodges in New Hampshire, members will discuss their history and the current 20 year growth in membership worldwide.

Among the presenters will be George Roberts who currently serves as Grand Noble at Chocorua Lodge #51. The former Speaker of the N.H. House will be available to answer questions and address why it was odd to find people organized for the purpose of giving aid to those in need and pursuing projects for the benefit of all humankind. Odd became a badge of honor in the three circles of Friendship, Love, and Truth and IOOF is also known as the "The Three Link Fraternity."
