From tapping a tree to tasting delicious maple syrup, you will have hands-on participation in every step of the syrup making process. Our environmental educators will help you to build tree ID skills and learn the parts of a tree and their functions, use measuring tools to find an appropriate tree to tap, use historical and modern tree tapping tools, learn the history of maple sugaring including Native American legends, and discover the math and chemical/physical science in the boiling process.

The program involves a 20 minute walk to our Sugar House—please note that you will be hiking back up hill after the program. Please wear boots and dress appropriately for the weather. Snowshoes will be provided as needed—bring your own if you have them!

Competition in the junior and senior divisions. For 10 years he played fiddle with the Broken String Band, a contra dance and swing band, based out of Bozeman, MT. Active in the chamber music scene, he's performed with several quartets in both New York and Boston.

Please come into the City Clerk's Office or use our convenient online service (click [here](#)). We will also be at the NH Humane Society Rabies Vaccination Clinics on March 18th and April 29th from 10 am until noon accepting registrations! Failure to register by April 30th is a violation of RSA 466:13 and subject to a Civil Forfeiture of no less than \$25 in fines and court fees plus any late fees. Fees for animal licensing are in accordance with RSA 466:4 as follows:

Altered dog (or puppy under 7 mos. old): \$6.50

Replacement tag: \$1.00

Unaltered dog: \$9.00

Late charge per month as of June 1: \$1.00

Senior (1st dog for owners over 65): \$2.00

Civil fine for failure to register by 4/30: \$25.00



New Hampshire's Hands Free Law took effect on July 1, 2015

REMINDER

- No use of **hand held electronic** devices while driving or temporarily halted in traffic for a stop sign or traffic signal or other momentary delays
- This includes cell phones, GPS, tablets, iPods, iPads or other devices that require data entry
- Emergency calls to 911 will be allowed
- Bluetooth or other **hands-free** electronic devices will be allowed
- **One hand** non-cellular 2-way radio use will be allowed
- Teen drivers under the age of 18 will not be allowed to use **any** electronic devices except to report an emergency

If your vehicle is not equipped with Bluetooth functionality, after-market systems can be installed or a Bluetooth speaker or over the ear device can be purchased at many retail stores including cell phone carriers and online distributors.

Penalties for Violations

1st Offense - \$100 fine 2nd offense - \$250 fine

3rd Offense within 2 years - \$500 fine

Penalty assessments will be added to the fines
