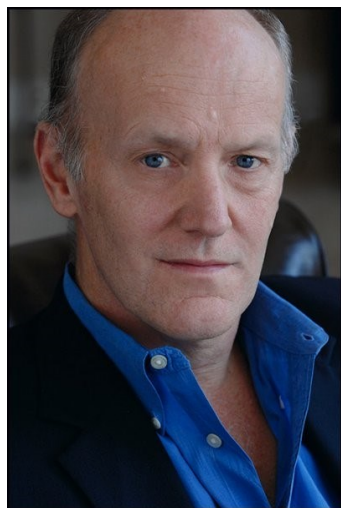

INTRODUCE INITIAL PLANS ON MARCH 16
FOR THE CITY'S 125TH ANNIVERSARY –
AND BEYOND**

"Celebrate Laconia," a group of local citizens, will announce initial plans March 16 to mark the 125th anniversary of Laconia in 2018 and discuss an ongoing mission to tout the City's appeal.

The news will come next week at a general meeting, from 6:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m., at Woodside at the Taylor Community, 435 Union Ave. The public is invited to meet the group's Board, led by President Pamela Clark, and see the "Celebrate Laconia" logo and branding.

Unaltered dog: \$9.00

Late charge per month as of June 1: \$1.00

Civil fine for failure to register by 4/30: \$25.00

Laconia Fire Department

Important
Message from
the Laconia
Fire Dept.

February 2017 was a record breaking month at Laconia Fire Department. It was the busiest February in history with 412 emergency calls. This number equals an average of 15 emergency calls each day. Eight percent of the calls were in the Weirs area, which is unusual for the winter months. And, it was the first time we exceeded 400 calls in a winter month. May and June of 2015 were the first months that ever exceeded 400 calls. Last year, June, July, August, September and November each exceeded 400 calls. An average February is 309 emergency calls; this is 33% above the average.

Since January 1 the Department has already handled 762 emergency calls. This number is 13% above the 3-year average. We've responded to 11 building fires in two months; two of those fires were serious. Year-to-date, 19% of all emergencies are between 11PM and 7AM – no quiet nights for LFD! Sixty-seven percent of all calls are in the downtown area (Wards 2,3,5 and the north section of Ward 4). We are maintaining a good response time reaching 69% of all incidents within 6 minutes. This is attributed to the fact that most calls are close to the Central Fire Station. Medical emergencies are a big part of our response. So far this year, 74% of all calls were EMS related. That still means that 26% were for fires, alarms, and other hazardous responses. There have been 42 serious medical emergency patients, which we refer to as Status 1 or 2 patients. Eighteen percent of all medical emergencies were indicated as high risk according to 911 protocols.

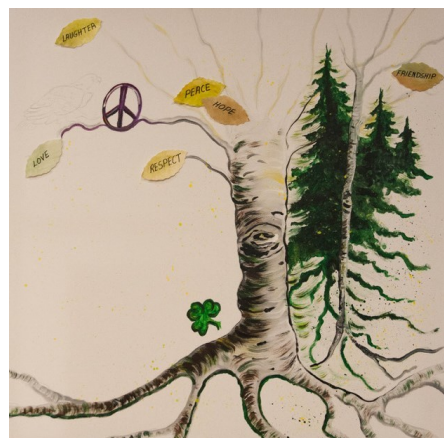
Why are we so busy? There were no major storms that impacted responses., but the population is aging which can lead to an increase in EMS type calls. Technology has definitely had an impact. Cell phones are everywhere and it is very easy to call 911. We've seen an increase in medical alarms and alerts. More people are connected via technology and simply push a button and an ambulance is called; however, in many cases, the ambulance was needed. We are always here to help when you need us!

The creative arts are often used in ways that benefit, inspire, and challenge a person to do more and be more than they ever thought possible. For those recovering from addiction, the creative arts can also save lives.

A program that started when several interested volunteers met with River Crew Art, a local homeless shelter, Creative Recovery, part of Navigating Recovery of the Lakes Region, began in December, 2016. The program offers art, photography, and video classes to recovering addicts. The goal is to teach not only artistic skills but also the more basic human values of self-worth. Through peer support and instructor confidence, an individual's competence and abilities grow, empowering them for very possibly the first time in their lives, allowing them to become a valued citizen in their community.



The works of art they create are donated to various organizations, clinics, and non-profit groups. Many projects involve group participation providing peer support and a sense of purpose for the individuals, replacing substance abuse while also giving back to the community. Similar to other start-up non-profits, the program solicits funding through private donations and by selling the participants' art and photography in a variety of venues.

Come to the meeting and meet two amazing individuals who are helping others to change their lives through art.

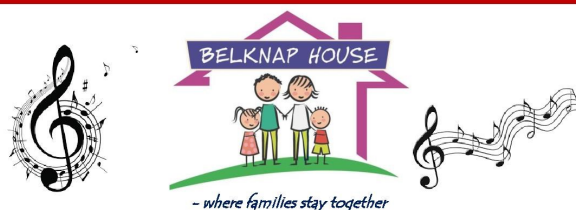
