

ALL ABOARD! CITY'S 125TH ANNIVERSARY PARTY STARTS EARLY WITH 'QUASQUICENTENNIAL' OF LACONIA PASSENGER TRAIN STATION ON AUGUST 19



Celebrate Laconia plans to begin celebrating Laconia's 125th anniversary a few months early with an old-fashioned train-focused festival August 19 marking the 'quasquicentennial' of the Laconia Passenger Station.

The daylong celebration of the station's birthday will take attendees back in time to when passenger trains thrived in Laconia. Festivities will include train rides, dignitaries, exhibits, food, shopping and music – including a barbershop quartet that will serenade passengers during 50-minute train rides.

Most of the events will take place from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. in Veterans Square, where the Laconia Passenger Station opened in 1892 for the Boston and Maine railroad, bustled through the 1950s, and still stands today as one of the City's most iconic structures.

"The 'anniversary train' is leaving the station a little early, and for good reason," said Pamela Clark, President of Celebrate Laconia, a group of local citizen volunteers. "Though Laconia's 125th anniversary isn't until 2018, the Laconia Passenger Station is too important to our City's history not to include its anniversary in our celebration of the City's past."

The inaugural event to start the City's anniversary celebration will begin in Veterans Square near Downtown at 11 a.m., with opening ceremonies hosted by radio personality Pat Kelly. It will feature dignitaries, such as former Mayors Rod Dyer and Paul Fitzgerald. Pleasant Street School students will sing.

Afterward, historians will give lectures on the station and the Laconia Streetcar Company at nearby Gale Memorial Library. Trains will offer rides throughout the day as barbershop quartet Lakes Region Chordsmen performs on all rides. Bank of New Hampshire is the Conductor Sponsor for the rides.

Vendors will set up in and near the square, Downtown stores will open, and there will be a pig roast at 4 p.m. at Local Eatery, 21 Veterans Square.

More event details will be released as the date draws nearer. The following schedule of musical performances has been set for the event, being sponsored by Binnie Media, Trustworthy Hardware and Denoncourt, Waldron & Sullivan, PA:

The 4th of July is almost here and the Laconia Fire Department wants to remind people to be very careful when celebrating our Independence Day, especially if you are going to use fireworks. Only permissible fireworks are allowed in Laconia, unless you are a licensed fireworks operator. Fireworks can be dangerous. Do not get complacent when using these explosives! According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), on Independence Day in a typical year more fires are reported across the country than any other day, and fireworks account for half of those fires. Five years ago, in Laconia we had an apartment house get destroyed by fire because of misuse of sparklers. Always be alert to the recent weather conditions; if it has not rained in a few days, then the ground cover will be dry, as will the rain gutters on your house, and your neighbor's house. Fireworks have landed on roofs and rolled down into the gutter and started fires.



Every year thousands of people are injured using fireworks. Adult males and teenagers are the most susceptible to injury. The injuries can be very severe. The best way to celebrate the holiday is to go to a public fireworks display. Check the newspapers to see what communities are providing fireworks displays. Laconia provides fireworks shows on July 3 at Weirs Beach and July 4 at Opechee Park.

If you do plan on using permissible fireworks you must be over 21 years of age and you must own the property or have the owner's permission. Permissible fireworks are allowed in Laconia. They may not be allowed in other communities. Keep children away from the fireworks especially while lighting them. Watch where the fireworks land and monitor the area for at least 30 minutes after you are done. Fireworks can land on roofs and in gutters and easily start a fire.

The State Fire Marshal gives this advice:

Be Prepared before lighting fireworks.

Purchase only New Hampshire Permissible Fireworks, available at licensed retail stores throughout the state.

Purchase ONLY the quantity that you will use.

Permissible fireworks can ONLY be displayed on property that you own, or with written permission from the landowner.

Contact your local fire department to check the daily forest fire weather forecast, or if outside burning has been prohibited.

Have a water hose or fire extinguisher nearby in case of an unanticipated fire.

Create a clear level surface to display your permissible fireworks away from things that can burn, or easily ignite.

Call 911 immediately in the event of a fire or medical emergency, don't wait!

Be Safe when lighting fireworks.

Adults 21 years of age or older are the only ones allowed to possess and display permissible fireworks.

Always wear eye, hearing protection and gloves.

Always read and follow the safety directions provided on each firework device or package and ask the store for additional information.

Light only one device at a time and move away quickly.

Keep all spectators at a safe distance.

Display permissible fireworks only outdoors, away from anything that can burn or easily ignite.

Be considerate of your neighbors, family pets and the environment. You can be held liable for damage to another's property.

"Be responsible" - when finished:

Clean up all debris when you are finished.

Devices that do not fire or discharge once they are lit are very dangerous; if a firework device does not fire or discharge, keep away for at least 15 minutes or more, then ensure that it has been filled with water or placed in a bucket of water.

- Always make sure that unused fireworks, matches and lighters are secured and out of the reach of children.

Please, 'Be Prepared', 'Be Safe', and 'Be Responsible' when using Permissible Consumer Fireworks, and celebrate safely this Fourth of July!
