




Due to overwhelming demand for our July program, we're having a second session of watercolor for adult craft night.

Come reminisce with Laconia native and author, Ruth Doan MacDougall. Ruth's first novel, *The Cheerleader*, was first published in 1973 and became a national best-seller. This coming of age novel perfectly captures what it was like to grow up here in the 1950s. A reviewer from The Philadelphia Inquirer states "...if future historians and sociologists are ever impelled to find out what it was like to be a high school student in America at mid-20th century, they will need to go no further than *The Cheerleader* for documentation and enlightenment."



The book's popularity led to the publication of six additional novels which have brought the characters into the 21st century. The most recent novel, *Site Fidelity*, was published in April. Ruth is the recipient of the New Hampshire Writers' Project's Lifetime Achievement Award.

CASTLE IN THE CLOUDS

Lucknow Estate, built in 1913-1914 high in the Ossipee Mountain Range. Known as **Castle in the Clouds** since its opening to the public in 1959, the house is an unusual example of Arts and Crafts architecture in New England, expressing that aesthetic movement's philosophy of living in harmony with nature. Designed by the architectural firm of J. Williams Beal & Sons of Boston, the house not only exhibits skilled hand craftsmanship in every aspect of its interior and exterior, but also features a number of technological innovations of the early 20th century.




