Kiepura was born in Paris, France and accepted to the Juilliard School Preparatory Division. He studied with Jeanneane Dowis and later coached with Menahem Pressler. His development as an artist has led him to focus on the music of Chopin. The pianist has given concerts in the U.S. and Europe of this composer's works. His own Polish ancestry has made Chopin a favorite choice of repertoire. Kiepura is also a published author who has written about Chopin. He lives with his wife Jane Knox-Kiepura in Littleton, NH.

myPatient Portal – Manage Your Health on Your Own Time

Patricia Rice, Communications Application Manager for LRGHealthcare, presents a program showing how you can securely access your health information 24/7 with the new myPatient Portal, Wednesday, Aug. 23 at 2 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building. This free event is open to the public.

One source for medical office and hospital information, the electronic health record via myPatient Portal includes your medical history, medications, allergies, immunizations, lab results, office notes, radiology reports and much more. MyPatient Portal is offered through a community health partnership between LRGHealthcare and Speare Memorial Health networks.

Updates from the Planning Office...

How would you like to help your fellow Laconia citizens? With just a few hours of your time each month you can make a difference and fill an important service. The City currently has openings for alternate members on a variety of boards and commissions, specifically the Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Conservation Commission and the Heritage Commission. We also need regular members for the Capital Improvement Committee. Usually there is one meeting a month, scheduled in the early evening, that lasts one to three hours (normally).

Alternate members fill in at meetings for regular members that can't make that meeting or for some other reason can't sit on a particular application. Being an alternate member is a great way to learn how the board functions and many times leads to becoming a regular member if desired. No experience is needed as we will train you. All you need is a willingness to learn and be fair and open minded.

The Planning Board hears applications for a variety of items concerning land use and new development and also the City's Master Plan. The Zoning Board of Adjustment is responsible for granting relief to zoning regulations and granting special exceptions. The Conservation Commission reviews plans and how they affect the environment. The Heritage Commission reviews how proposals may affect the City's cultural history and architecture. The Capital Improvement Committee reviews the City's plans for larger expenditures for improvement projects and equipment replacement and helps determine their appropriateness. This committee meets 2-3 times a month from mid-September thru early December only.

Any questions about any of these boards can be directed to the Planning Department at 527-1264. Ask for Director Dean Trefethen or Assistant Director Brandee Loughlin. We hope to be hearing from you soon!

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Designation of the following streets as Emergency Lanes under RSA 231:59-a, Emergency Lanes: Cotton Hill Rd., Dell Avenue, Eastman Shore Rd. North, Lucerne Avenue, McKinley Rd., Regis Rd. and Wentworth Avenue. The purpose of an emergency road declaration is to enable the City to repair and maintain a Class VI or private road to keep it passable by emergency vehicles when it is a welfare and safety issue for the public.

Resolution RES-2017-20 re: authorizing the City Manager to accept and expend grants on behalf of the City in an amount of \$20,000 for Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) Equipment, and RES-2017-21 re: authorizing the City Manager to accept and expend grants on behalf of the City in an amount of \$2,700 for E-Ticket Equipment.

Bear is healthy now. He does have a virus present in his blood which presents zero health concern to humans. We strongly recommend that should he be adopted into a that already has cats, that they receive their leukemia vaccine as a precaution.

With a loving, indoor, safe home, we can expect Bear to lead a relatively normal life. It's true, he may not live to a ripe old age, but surely he can enjoy life to the fullest right now.

Bear would be happy in just about any home with friendly dogs, kind and respectful children, adults who can commit to an indoor only home, and yes, even other cats, as long as they are already vaccinated against the virus.


