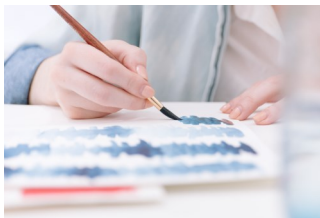

ADULT PROGRAMS

230TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Thursday, September 21 @ 7pm
Laconia Rotary Hall

The Constitution of the United States was the product of lengthy and serious deliberations in the summer of 1787 by a remarkable group of Americans who were intent on addressing the defects of the confederal system that was established by the Articles of Confederation in 1781.

Dr. David Marion will explain what the debates that transpired during the summer of 1787 at the convention held in Philadelphia reveal about the nature of the American constitutional system. He also will explain how an examination of what transpired at the constitutional convention can pay real dividends today as we labor to preserve the constitutional system crafted by George Washington, James Madison, and Alexander Hamilton, among other prominent Framers of the United States Constitution.

Dr. Marion is Elliott Professor Emeritus of Government and Director of the James Madison Public Service Program at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia. He has been invited to speak at the U.S. Supreme Court, the National Archives, Mount Vernon (George Washington's plantation home) and Montpelier (James Madison's plantation home), among other places in the United States, Canada, and Europe. The author of over fifty publications, he received a national award for his book on the late Supreme Court Justice William Brennan and has been featured in programs on PBS and National Public Radio.

PRESTON HELLER, THE MENTALIST

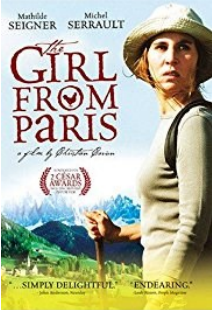
