The Laconia School District is appreciative of the valuable contributions you make to our community through your efforts in our school. Anyone interested in volunteering should please contact the principal of the school for which you wish to volunteer.

Anyone who volunteers for the Laconia School District must complete an annual volunteer affidavit. A criminal background check, including obtaining the results of district processed fingerprinting, is also required. This process must be completed prior to the beginning of any volunteer event or activity. (Fingerprinting does not need to be completed annually).

If you plan to coach a team, chaperone a field trip, work on a school-wide activity, or help in the classroom anytime during the upcoming school year, you should plan to take advantage of one the fingerprinting clinics we will be offering in September at the SAU located at 39 Harvard Street, Laconia, NH.

Please be aware that it may take up to four weeks for the fingerprints to be processed. Volunteers are not able to begin until the background check is complete. Be sure to bring a photo identification with you - we cannot fingerprint without proper identification. You may also contact Allison Caron at the SAU office at 603-524-5710 to schedule a time for you to have your fingerprints done if you cannot attend one of our clinics.

## Public Works Department

### ***Public Input Session***

A Public Input Session for residents, businesses and all property owners regarding the 2018 Court Street Improvement Project has been scheduled for September 21, 2017 from 7 pm to 9 pm in City Hall, Room 200A (upstairs).

The purpose of this Public Input Session is to present the initial concept for improvements to Court Street. Construction of this project is planned to begin in 2018.

The City is in the early stages of designing the improvements from Main Street to the boundary with Belmont.

The City's Department of Public Works and McFarland-Johnson, the engineering firm designing the road, will present the results of its investigation and will be asking residents, businesses and property owners for input to help complete the design. The team is particularly interested in what areas may temporarily flood during a storm and how much flooding occurs in those areas.

The team will discuss its findings on the road's drainage system, sidewalks, travel lanes and structure, as well as the conceptual timeline for the project.

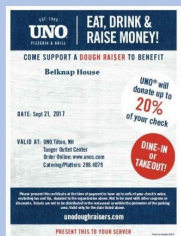

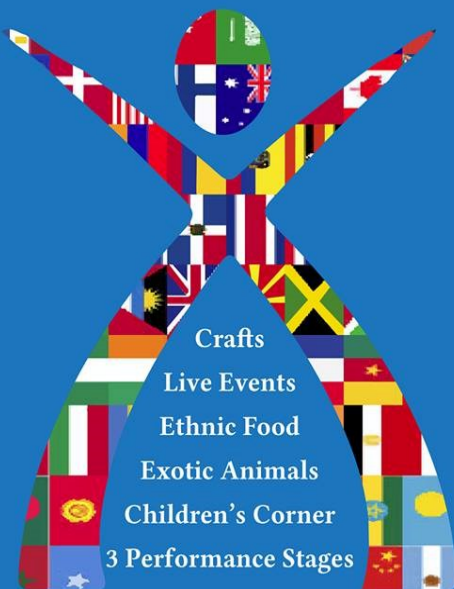

Laconia Fire Department and Emergency Management officials are monitoring Hurricane Irma closely. This storm will impact Florida starting Friday, Sept. 8. At this time, it is a very powerful Category 5 hurricane. According to NOAA it is one of the most powerful Atlantic hurricanes in recent history. The reason we are so interested in Irma is that it is following a similar track to Hurricane Donna in 1960, which ended up making a second landfall in North Carolina as a Category 2 hurricane, and then a third landfall on Long Island, New York.

Donna formed in late August, 1960 and developed into a Category 4 storm. Hurricane Donna hit southern Florida on September 10 and then hit Long Island on September 12. National Weather Service is uncertain as to whether Hurricane Irma may turn north/northeast after hitting Florida.

Donna did significant damage in Vermont, dropping up to 5 inches of rain with many trees damaged and power lines downed. Rainfall in New Hampshire peaked at 7.25 inches in Peterborough. The storm damaged boats along the seacoast and winds took down trees and power lines in the lower half of the state. Not far behind Irma is Tropical Storm Jose, which is predicted to become a hurricane this weekend. The Atlantic Hurricane season occurs from June 1 to November 1 and peaks each year around September 10. Recent tropical storms to hit New England and New Hampshire have been Floyd on September 17, 1999; Irene on August 29, 2011, which produced major flooding along the Vermont border; and Sandy on October 28, 2012, which did widespread damage in New Hampshire and left over 200,000 residents without power.

Even though we are inland from the southern New England coast, history has shown that tropical storms can reach New Hampshire. As always, we urge residents to think about planning ahead for any type of emergency. Go to [Ready.gov](#) for more information about emergency preparations.

The Lakes Region Art Association will hold its up-coming meeting on Monday, September 18, 7pm, at the Lakes Region Art Association Gallery located at the Tanger Outlets in Tilton, NH.

Calligraphy and mixed media artist Adele Sanborn, a graduate with a BFA from Rochester Institute of Technology was born and raised in Long Island,

NY. In the 70's, she and her husband moved to Boscawen, NH. In 1984, Adele started Cornerstone Design, a graphic design firm. And in 1990, she opened Caardvark, a retail store in downtown Concord. In the early 2000s she pursued a career in calligraphy and papermaking out of her studio, The Paint Box, in Webster, NH. Then in 2015 she moved her business to TWIGGS Gallery in Boscawen, NH where she works and sells her work as well as the work of other artists. She's been a member of the League of NH Craftsmen since 1975, juried in papermaking, photography, and calligraphy. She is also represented at several galleries in the New England area.



Her creations combine her "love of lettering, paper, and photographic images into framed messages celebrating life and its possibilities." In Adele's artist statement she says, "I am an art maker, a pathfinder, and a storyteller. I use whatever materials it takes to begin my journey, and within each piece are words, poems, passages that I hand letter and combine to create an image filled with questions or perhaps answers." The demonstration by Adele Sanborn is free and open to the public. Adele will share her art and her story of how she got to where she is today and also give a demonstration in hand-lettering.
