230th Anniversary of the Constitutional Convention September 21, 2017

The Constitution of the United States was the product of lengthy and serious deliberations in the summer of 1787 by a remarkable group of Americans who were intent on addressing the defects of the confederal system that was established by the Articles of Confederation in 1781. Dr. David Marion will explain what the debates that transpired during that time reveal about the nature of the American constitutional system. He also will explain how an examination of what transpired at the constitutional convention can pay real dividends today as we labor to preserve the constitutional system crafted by George Washington, James Madison, Alexander Hamilton and others.

Dr. Marion is Elliott Professor Emeritus of Government and Director of the James Madison Public Service Program at Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia. He has been invited to speak at the U.S. Supreme Court, the National Archives, Mount Vernon (George Washington's plantation home) and Montpelier (James Madison's plantation home), among other places in the US, Canada and Europe. The author of over 50 publications, he received a national award for his book on the late Supreme Court Justice William Brennan and has been featured in programs on PBS and National Public Radio.



Olga Morrill will feature a presentation entitled **Vagabond Quakers at 7 p.m. Monday, September 18, in Rotary Hall** on the Lower Level of the Laconia Public Library, under the auspices of the Laconia Historical and Museum Society.

Before 1840, the New Hampshire region we know as Belknap County was a part of Strafford County. The County seat of Dover and points west toward the Lakes Region were often hiding places for those who lived just outside of ridged Puritan doctrine. Before the American Revolution, these 17th and 18th century stories of those seeking religious freedom and independence abound. During these early years of European settlement, the Province of New Hampshire frequently shared the law, governors, and overall enforcement with the Massachusetts Bay Colony. The Salem Witch Trials of the 1690's was part of a cruel sensibility that cast a wide net of suspicion and deceit among Indians and settlers alike.

Olga Morrill brings an extensive background in these studies to this event. She recently completed 24 years as Program Coordinator and Librarian with the Conway Public Library. An accomplished Storyteller, Olga's repertoire includes music, a wealth of historic New Hampshire oversight, the Drama Studio, as well as the NH Writers Project. Ms. Morrill is a fixture in statewide story forums and students of all ages will enjoy her grasp of subject and substance.

Learn of the remarkable brutality of the Puritan authorities in the Massachusetts Bay Colony against the Society of Friends through fascinating true stories from the 17th and 18th centuries.

A Public Input Session for residents, businesses and all property owners regarding the 2018 Court Street Improvement Project has been scheduled for September 21, 2017 from 7 pm to 9 pm in City Hall, Room 200A (upstairs).

The purpose of this Public Input Session is to present the initial concept for improvements to Court Street. Construction of this project is planned to begin in 2018.

The City's Department of Public Works and McFarland-Johnson, the engineering firm designing the road, will present the results of its investigation and will be asking residents, businesses and property owners for input to help complete the design. The team is particularly interested in what areas may temporarily flood during a storm and how much flooding occurs in those areas.






