





## Tropical Storms Weather Emergency Terms to Know

**Tropical Storm Warning** —Tropical storm conditions with sustained winds from 30 to 73 mph are expected in the warning area within the next 24 hours.

**Tropical Storm Watch** —Tropical storm conditions with sustained winds from 39 to 73 mph are possible in the watch area within the next 36 hours.

### BEFORE a Tropical Storm Occurs:

- Make sure you have ready access to emergency equipment such as flashlights, first aid kits, and battery operated radios.
- Make plans to protect your building(s).
- Check and clear roof drains, scuppers, gutters and storm drains to ensure proper water drainage.
- Secure loose outdoor objects or bring them inside.
- If power is lost, turn off major appliances to reduce power surge when electricity is restored.

A backup generator is always useful in an emergency situation. If you do have one, inspect it periodically to make sure it will function properly when needed. Due to potential CO poisoning, a generator should be placed only in outside areas away from windows and doors.

### DURING and AFTER a tropical storm:

- Listen for current weather reports and emergency information.
- Drive only when necessary. The streets may be filled with debris and standing water, making roads impassable.
- Stay away from downed power lines and trees.
- Avoid loose or dangling power lines and report them immediately to the power company, police, or fire department.
- Open windows and doors to ventilate and dry your building(s) if they become wet. In addition, call a water damage remediation company immediately to begin water removal and drying.
- Stay tuned to local radio stations for situation updates.

The NH Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles will be implementing a new computer system in the month of October that will affect the processing of Motor Vehicle Registrations in the entire State between October 6<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>. During this outage the City Clerk's Office, as well as all State of NH-DMV locations, will be unable to process any Motor Vehicle or Driver's Licensing transactions, including online requests. Beginning on the morning of Wednesday, October 11, 2017 the computer system is anticipated to be operational and processing can resume.



## Pet of the Week: Molly



Big fat cats seem to be the order of the day at New Hampshire Humane Society, **we** love them, the adopting public is in awe of their size, and our staff veterinarian says "must lose weight!"

Molly, aged just six years old, is a very large cat. Surrendered by her family when they needed to focus on eldercare issues, she has lived her life mostly laying languidly on the back of the sofa and demanding food, which she received regularly, and probably when one acknowledges the sheer girth of her midriff, gobbled up a little too much kibble.

She is a sweet, personable cat. Currently tipping the scale at 22.7lbs; in her defense, she has already shed one and a half pounds since beginning her diet and exercise program at New Hampshire Humane Society.

We hope for a home that will continue this regime, encourage her to walk about the house, and monitor her treats. Obesity for Molly is both uncomfortable and detrimental to her health and longevity.

For now she has her own special accommodations at New Hampshire Humane Society, not confined to a cage and not residing with a group of other cats where she would undoubtedly help herself to more than her fair share of food. Come and see the Portly Princess, she really is a peach!

## The Belknap Mill receives New Hampshire Humanities Grant for *Rosie's Mom: Forgotten Women of the First World War*

The Belknap Mill has received a grant from New Hampshire Humanities to present ***Rosie's Mom: Forgotten Women of the First World War*** on Wednesday, September 27, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.

One hundred years ago, a full generation before Rosie the Riveter, American women rolled up their sleeves and entered war industries where they had never been welcome before. They ran powerful machinery, learned new skills, and faced the sullen hostility of the men in the shops. In this illustrated lecture, historian Carrie Brown reveals their courage and their hard work, asks what impact "the Great War" had on their lives, and explores how these women helped shape the work that their more famous daughters would do in the next World War.

Carrie Brown holds a PhD in American Literature and Folklore from the University of Virginia. She is an independent scholar who also works as a freelance history curator for museums in New England. She has curated two exhibitions on the Civil War for the American Precision Museum, as well as exhibitions on the history of aviation, the early years of the automobile and the bicycle. The author of two books and many articles and exhibit catalogs, Brown delights in finding connections between changing technology and the evolution of popular culture. This program is free and open to the public.
