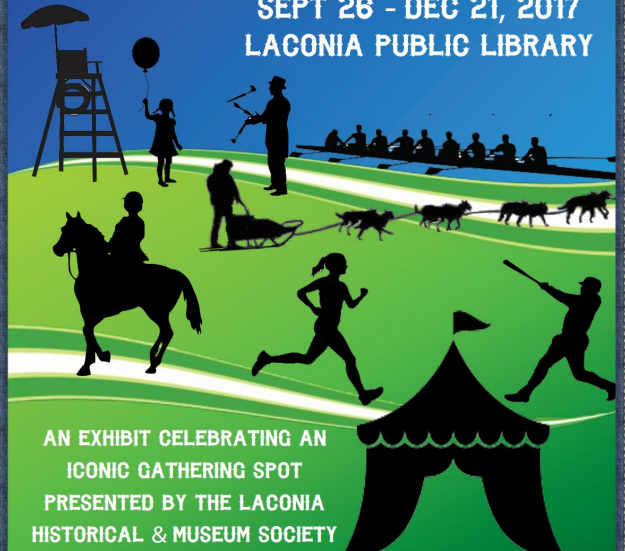

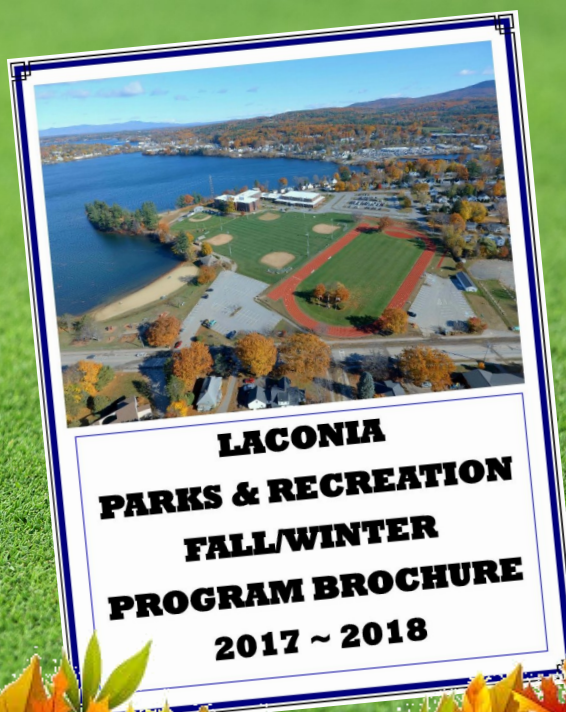

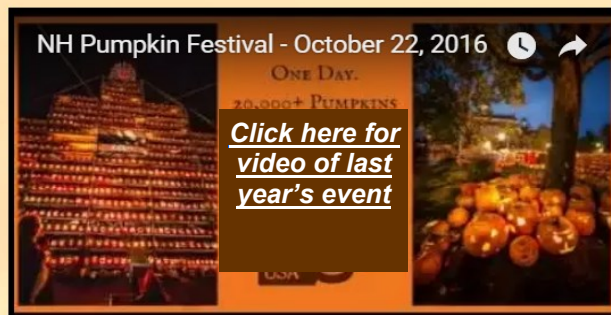

Motor Vehicle Outage Planned for October 6-10, 2017

The NH Department of Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles will be implementing a new computer system in the month of October that will affect the processing of Motor Vehicle Registrations in the entire State between October 6th – 10th. During this outage the City Clerk's Office, as well as all State of NH-DMV locations, will be unable to process any Motor Vehicle or Driver's Licensing transactions, including online requests. Beginning on the morning of Wednesday, October 11, 2017 the computer system is anticipated to be operational and processing can resume.
