## CA\$H Coalition of the Lakes Region —Volunteer Mentor Description

The CA\$H (Creating Assets, Savings & Hope) Coalition of the Lakes Region seeks 10 adult volunteers to serve as mentors for adults of low-to-moderate income, with a desire to improve one or more areas of their personal financial management.

**Time commitment:** Approximately two hours every two-to-three weeks over a six month period from November 2017 until April 2018. Training will be provided on October 12 and 26, 2017.

**Program description:** Mentors and participants will be expected to attend monthly group meetings. These will be facilitated sessions on a topic specific to financial management with time for individual discussion. Goal-setting will be part of the individual discussion, based on topics relevant to the participant's situation. Scheduled dates are:

November 9	February 8
December 14	March 8
January 11	April 12

Light meal and child care provided.

Some of the goal areas/discussion topics will include developing a saving and spending plan, managing the holidays without going deep into debt, paying for college, credit building and repair.

Mentors will assist program participants in setting financial goals and discuss progress toward meeting those goals with their "mentee".

**Training:** Training sessions for all mentors will be provided, scheduled for October 12 and October 26 shortly before the program begins. It will include a review of resources to refer participants who need more extensive assistance in such areas as job search, credit repair, managing their household budget and other relevant topics.

**Matching:** Mentors will be paired with participants at the first session, to be held in November.

**Participants:** People with a desire to make improvements in their financial lives will self-refer or be referred by others. Participants will either be employed or actively seeking employment. Program staff will conduct a conversation with prospective participants to assess their readiness for success.

**Reporting:** Tylaine Guarriello from the Family Resource Center of Central NH in Laconia, where groups meetings will be held, along with Karen Wilson of Bank of NH, will supervise the program.
