

In the Evil Day: Individual Rights, Town Government, and the Crime That Stunned the Nation

Need help getting rid of that Christmas Tree now that the holidays are over?





Discovering New England Stone Walls



Why are we so fascinated with stone walls? Kevin Gardner, author of "The Granite Kiss," explains how and why New England came to acquire its thousands of miles of stone walls in a presentation Wednesday, Jan. 17 at 6:30 p.m. at Taylor Community's Woodside Building. Be cautious of the risk of snow and ice causing roof collapse!



The Laconia Fire Department is issuing a warning. So far this winter we have received over 2 feet of snow. Most of this snow is still on our roofs. It is a very dry snow and will easily absorb rain water. The upcoming forecast includes some warmer temperatures and rain. Now is the time to take action and clear your roof of snow. Heavy snow loads can affect the structural integrity of homes and businesses and can lead to partial or total roof collapse. The winter of 2008 was an extreme snow year and we had 22 roof collapses from excessive snow and rain.

This has been an exceptional start to winter with snow and extreme cold. Just because your building has never had problems before does not make it immune to collapse. If you have a flat roof or low pitch roof your roof is at greater risk. Snow drifts can accumulate near chimneys and walls and result in 3 or more feet of snow.

Steep roofs are less prone to problems. However, watch where the shedding snow lands. It can cause serious build-ups on canopies or porch roofs. With rain forecast, the snow will absorb the rain and the added weight will be significant. Wet snow can weigh well over 50 pounds per cubic foot; the deeper the snow the heavier it is. Snow acts like a sponge and absorbs moisture. Ice dams compound the problems by not letting rain water run off the roof.

Emergency actions are required if you hear or see cracking in the walls or ceilings, if glass windows suddenly break, if doors jam and won't open or close, if plaster crumbles or falls, or you see new clean wood at joints where it was never before - call 911. If you feel the building moving or it rumbles – get out immediately. Determining structural integrity is beyond the scope of this warning. A professional contractor and engineer can be very helpful in determining your roof load capacity

Problems will be compounded and intensified if you have poor drainage or roof drains on flat roofs are clogged. Large icicles and ice dams add significant weight and don't allow water to drain properly. If you have added weight to the roof by using the attic for storage you are already stressing the roof system. We started insulating our attics about 40 years ago; this means snow does not melt and slide off the roofs as it did in the "old days". Energy efficiency results in snow build-up.

Removing snow from the roof can be a major problem. Safety is paramount. A roof rake is the simplest method for pitched roofs. There are many contractors who are willing to clear roofs of snow. Make sure they are insured. If you do it yourself be careful of where you throw snow. You don't want to hit a person walking by your home with a shovel full of snow. For clearing flat roofs, you must have a system and a plan. You need to clear the edges first, and then clear the area further in on the roof. This snow gets blown back to the edges, and then the edges need to be cleared again. If you start from the inside first and work to the edges you will severely overload the edges. Plus, the added weight of the people doing the work in addition to snow blowers that might be used, and the roof could reach its breaking point.

The Building Inspector, through the City's Code Enforcement Department, has also issued a notice asking residents to frequently inspect their roof for high levels of snow buildup and ice dam formation along the eaves.
