Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation applications are now available online via our website at: lrscholarship.org. You can either fill them out on line and email them to us, OR print out a copy and mail them. The final deadline for filing an application is April 1, 2018. You can also get a copy from the guidance offices at area high schools, or by calling 603-527-3533.

DON'T MISS THE DEADLINE!

We also have a few unique scholarships that are exceptions to our usual application process. The first is the Annalee Thorndike Art Competition Scholarship. This is available to high school seniors planning on majoring in art related fields. Another exceptional scholarship opportunity is the John F. Mullen Memorial Essay Competition award. The Mullen award requires students who compete to write an essay that describes an experience that has made a difference in the student's life, with an emphasis on a change in attitude, behavior or ambition which this experience might have caused in them. We also have two special awards available to students going into a construction related field, sponsored by the Lakes Region Board of Builders and Remodelers. This past year the Gilmanton American Legion Auxiliary Stockwell award added their scholarship to our family. This is also an essay competition, open to students from Gilmanton, NH. During the cold winter months, broken pipes sometimes occur after the water in them has frozen. Water expands as it freezes, and if the water is trapped inside a pipe with no escape, the expanding ice will cause the pipe to burst. Cracks may appear along the length of a pipe or joints may break away. A burst water pipe can release thousands of gallons of water causing a great deal of damage to your home.

Water in pipes can also freeze even if the house is heated. For example, freezing can occur when pipes run through an unheated attic, garage or crawl space. All may be well during the day when water is in frequent use,

since the constant flow keeps bringing in warmer water. However, at night, when the water is not moving and the temperature continues to drop, those pipes can freeze.

The Water Department has responded to numerous cases of frozen pipes this winter and the sooner we can contact property owners the better off they are. Please help us help you by providing us with emergency contact information. The form below can be completed and faxed to us at (603) 528-5964, or you can [click here](#) to fill out and submit the form on-line. Providing this information will allow us to update our records to reach you in an emergency.



Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation Celebrates Past, Looks Forward, and Announces Scholarship Deadline

At the Annual Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation Board of Trustees meeting held on January 17th, new Board officers were elected. They include: Donna Hennessey, President; Lori Fasshauer, Vice President; Pam Hayes, Corporate Secretary; and James Waldron, Treasurer. The Board said good-bye to Lisa Bianco who has been with LRSF for nine years and has reached her term limit, and Sarah Svindland who has served since 2012. Lisa Bianco has also been one member of a team that has participated in the Foundation's Annual Community Spelling Bee for a number of years. Both of these women have been valued members of our team, sharing their knowledge, time, and expertise over the years.

LRSF also welcomed new Board members: Fredda Osman and Marjory Wilkinson. Fredda Osman recently retired from the State of NH Department of Health and Human Services working with local health centers and area agencies. Fredda has had a connection to the Foundation for a number of years, as she is the donor representative for three of their donor funds: the Ed & Polly Chertok Fund, the LHS Class of 1965 and the LHS Class of 1933, where she has long represented her dad. Marj Wilkinson is a retired teacher who shared her love of language arts for many years with the young people at Memorial Middle School. She is involved in a number of volunteer activities in the area and is the donor representative for the LHS Class of 1964.

These are not the only changes at Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation this year. Paulette Loughlin has stepped up to the Executive Director position and Karen Switzer came on as the new Assistant Director in the Fall. Together they will be taking on former Executive Director, Joan Cormier's role. Donna Hennessey, new LRSF Board president, thanked immediate past-president, Mike Nolan, for all his accomplishments over his past couple years. She commented "I have some big shoes to fill and I look forward to serving the Foundation as President the next two years." Mike Nolan will remain with the Foundation for another year as a Trustee, finishing out his third three-year term on the Board. Hennessey added, "To recap this past year, we awarded scholarships to 286 local students to continue their education through the generosity of 250 donors. We were the recipients of 11 new funds. We also upgraded our computers and systems with help from the \$27,500 in grants we received from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation and the Bank of NH. Our 18th Annual Community Spelling Bee was a great success with net proceeds of over \$10,000, the best year we have ever had."

New Executive Director Paulette Loughlin added "We will not be just resting on our laurels in 2018, we are already planning for an outstanding year to follow up our success from the past. Scholarship applications for 2018 are now available online through our website: www.lrscholarship.org with an application deadline of April 1, 2018. The Annalee Thorndike Art Competition Committee is working and planning for the art show in April. Our Donors' Day date has been set for Wednesday, May 23rd and we have plans for our 18th Annual Community Spelling Bee, tentatively scheduled for October 25th of this year at Laconia High School. All of this would not be possible without the support of our donors, benefactors and the Lakes Region Community." Assistant Director Karen Switzer continued with Loughlin's remarks by adding: "Any additional application information or questions may be answered by contacting us via email scholarship@lrscholarship.org or calling the office at 603-527-3533. Switzer echoed Loughlin's comment that the application deadline for Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation is April 1, 2018.

Updates from the Planning Office...

The City of Laconia is in the process of updating and adopting a new Master Plan. A draft version of a proposed Vision Statement and Land Use Chapter is on the City's website for residents and other interested parties to review and make comments. Please visit the Planning Department's webpage and click on the [Master Plan tab](#) to view the draft document and also to submit comments.

The proposed update to the Master Plan is intended to be a significant change in direction for the City's planning and zoning policies. Once the Vision Statement and Land Use Chapter are adopted by the Planning Board (in March or April), the Planning Department and Planning Board will start the process of updating the City's Zoning Ordinance, Site Plan Regulations, and Subdivision Regulations.

Other chapters of the Master Plan will also be updated and adopted over the next couple of years.


