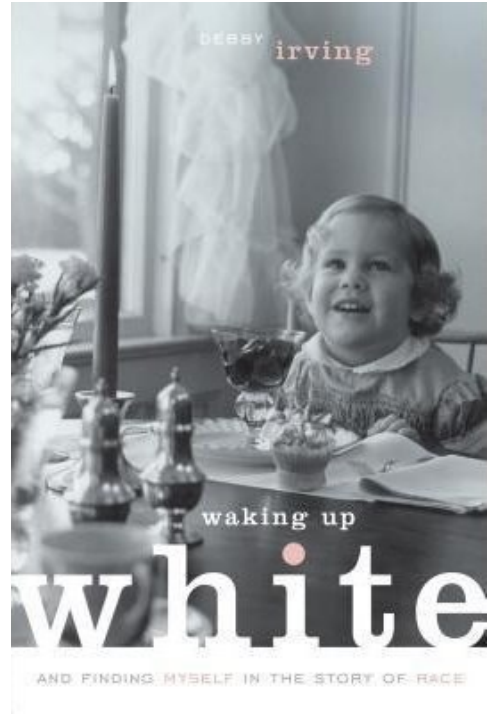
THE AMERICAN DREAM: DEAD OR ALIVE?

WAKING UP WHITE BY DEBBY IRVING

For twenty-five years, Debby Irving sensed inexplicable racial tensions in her personal and professional relationships. As a colleague and neighbor, she worried about offending people she dearly wanted to befriend. As an arts administrator, she didn't understand why her diversity efforts lacked traction. As a teacher, she found her best efforts to reach out to students and families of color left her wondering what she was missing. Then, in 2009, one "aha!" moment launched an adventure of discovery and insight that drastically shifted her worldview and upended her life plan. In *Waking Up White*, Irving tells her often cringe-worthy story with such openness that readers will turn every page rooting for her-and ultimately for all of us.

AN EVENING WITH BEAR EXPERT BEN KILHAM

Ben Kilham, New Hampshire's only licensed bear rehabilitator, will share his firsthand experiences raising cubs and observing black bear behavior. Ben Kilham is a wildlife biologist based in Lyme, New Hampshire. He and his wife Debra have accepted orphaned bear cubs into their home and enabled them to successfully return to the wild. Ben has been the focus of several news articles and documentaries, including National Geographic's "A Man Among Bears" and Animal Planet's "Papa Bear." He is also co-author of the books "Among the Bears: Raising Orphaned Cubs in the Wild" and "In the Company of Bears: What Black Bears Have Taught Me About Intelligence and Intuition."
