


**“Lunch and Learn”



GOT LUNCH! Laconia, a summer healthy lunch program that delivers healthy groceries directly to the child's home every Monday morning, will begin deliveries June 18th. **June 11th is the deadline** to receive the first delivery on June 18th. You may begin participating at any time throughout the summer, but new registrations close one week before each delivery date. The program runs each Monday through August 27th.

All Laconia school age children are eligible. Although our target population is those families who qualify for 'free and reduced' lunches at the school, it is NOT a requirement for participation. If you need help feeding your children/child this summer, this program is designed for you. GOT LUNCH! Laconia does not want any child to go hungry this summer.

Each year we require a new registration form for you to participate, even if you participated last year. LACONIA WATER DEPARTMENT CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

The Consumer Confidence Report, or CCR, is an annual water quality report that a community water system is required to provide by law. In 1996, the U.S. Congress and the President amended the Safe Drinking Water Act by adding a provision requiring that all community water systems deliver to their customers an annual water quality report. The law specifies certain content for the reports, and requires water systems to distribute these reports to all of their customers.

The CCRs summarize information that water systems are required to collect. Included in the report is a description of our treatment process as well as water testing that was done in the previous calendar year. Also included is information on household liquid waste materials and awareness of fertilizer use for lawn care. Our water testing is extensive and it includes, but is not limited to, Microbiology (bacteria), Volatiles (fuels), Synthetics (pesticides), and Inorganics. Each year our test results are well below the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) and for the most part are below detection limits.

Parking at Weirs Beach!



Please note that parking is now being enforced in Weirs Beach at the two public parking locations: Lakeside Avenue and Endicott Rock Park. Both locations are metered. The kiosks accept only coins or credit/debit cards. The City uses kiosks and a "pay by space" system in both locations. Visitors must pay to park between the hours of 9:00 am and 10:00 pm at either location.

There are five, three and two hour parking spaces available on Lakeside Avenue.

Parking at these spaces costs \$1.00 per hour. Endicott Rock Park parking lot has no time limits; it costs \$2.00 per hour to park there. If you have a Laconia Resident Beach sticker on your vehicle, you will not have to pay to park at the Endicott Rock Park parking lot, but you will have to pay for parking at the kiosks on Lakeside Avenue. Please note that the parking enforcement described above does not apply during Motorcycle Week; please refer to the Temporary Traffic Order in effect from 6/8 thru 6/17.



News from the Planning Department

TINY HOUSES STILL REQUIRE PERMITS!



Maybe you've seen that cable TV show about Tiny Houses and how they seem to put them almost anywhere there's room. They never seem to mention on TV the need to get proper permits and approvals. The Planning Department would like to remind property owners that the key word in the phrase "Tiny House" is the word HOUSE, because that's what they are, and they are regulated just like any other housing unit in the City.

Your backyard may not be able to have a Tiny House if you're in the Single Family zone or your lot may not be big enough for a second unit even if in an allowable zone, and all the usual setbacks from property lines would still apply. Plus, there are also reviews and permits required for electrical, water and sewer connections for any type of housing unit, not to mention they need to be anchored to the ground properly in case of high winds. Inspections would be required to make sure anyone living in such a unit is safe.

If you start thinking about the idea of a Tiny House, your first discussion should be with the Planning Department to see if you can do it on your property and what the reviews and requirements would be.

What Can Go Down a Storm Drain?



Most storm drains lead into a local body of water without being filtered or treated. When pollutants are put down the storm drains, it hurts the ecosystem of beautiful lakes, ponds, or other local bodies of water.

What can go down a storm drain:

Only storm water can go down a storm drain. Any other water could be contaminated with soap, oil, or any other pollutants.

The Drain is Just For Rain!

Any pollutants that go in a storm drain can pollute your local water. Most storm drains lead to a body of water. What leaves the drains goes straight into the body of water without being treated.


Notice to Laconia Residents & Businesses Three Remote Recycling Drop-Off Centers to Close Monday June 25, 2018




Resident beach stickers for Bond Beach or Weirs Beach are now available in the City Clerk and Tax Collector Offices!


