Public Works Department

As part of the Court Street Roadway Improvement Project, the City's contractor, Busby Construction, will be doing night work to upgrade the sewer mains at the intersection of Fair Street and Court Street. The work is scheduled for Sunday, July 1 and Monday, July 2 and will begin at 6pm and last through the night. There is no planned disruption to water or sewer services. Traffic will be detoured. The work is being done after hours to take advantage of low flow in the sewer pipes and to minimize traffic disruptions.



Resident Beach Stickers Now Available!




Resident beach stickers for Bond Beach or Weirs Beach are now available in the City Clerk and Tax Collector Offices!



The 5th Annual Mae West Memorial Bike Ride was a smashing success!

In addition to seeing and hearing just under 200 bikes firing up their engines on Monday morning of Laconia Motorcycle Week, the site of more than 270 people standing in line to sign up for the ride was breathtakingly powerful. "We actually underestimated the number of people and wound up running out of wristbands," said Rick Dumont, the Community Stewardship Coordinator for the Humane Society. Thankfully, event coordinator Doug Assermley of Sick Boy Motorcycles, was able to MacGyver a solution. The wrist bands were used both as signifiers of those donor participants in the ride, but also so they could attend the post ride free feed at the Broken Spoke Saloon.

This year's ride generated more than \$2,000 more than last year with a tally showing a little more than \$12,000 was raised for our shelter operations. Last year 178 bikes thundered through the area raising \$10,000.

Initiated by an amazing couple five years ago, Sick Boy Motorcycles owners, Doug and Misty Assermley, each year take on the yeoman's task of organizing the event in honor of Motorcycle Week Executive Director Charlie St. Clair's late cat Mae West.

Dubbed "For the Love of Pets" the annual ride starts at Rally Headquarters at the Weirs and the rolling thunder of bikers wind their way out to NHIS, where, through the extreme generosity and support for our shelter, the track is opened up so bikers can air it out and spin through a couple of laps. From there the ride rolls back into town for a post ride lunch provided by the Broken Spoke Saloon, thanks to the generosity of Melissa Penland, Bob Pomerenke and their team.

"We cannot possibly thank all of the riders, donors, Melissa, Bob, Doug and everyone involved enough for putting so much of their energy into making this such a tremendous success each year," Dumont said. "It is such a beautiful thing to bring so many bikers together to support our continuous care and rehoming the needy animals of our area as well as those who come to us. We are very grateful to all."

New Hampshire Humane Society is one of the oldest animal shelters in the Granite State offering adoption services, low cost spay/neuter, education outreach, volunteer opportunities, pet therapy, internship and service learning, enrichment and foster care for over 1300 abandoned, neglected, and unwanted animals in the region.

YOU'RE IN BEAR COUNTRY!

The USDA Wildlife Service works closely with the NH Fish and Game Department to mitigate human-bear conflicts throughout the state. They are reaching out to cities and towns in NH in the hopes of providing some information about black bears and mitigating bear concerns on city and town websites and Facebook pages.

Prime black bear habitat includes deciduous forests (oaks, maple, beech etc.), wetlands, and riparian (along rivers) zones. The natural areas surrounding Laconia provide very good habitat for black bears. Many human-bear conflicts arise when bears frequent properties to access food attractants that are found around homes. The most common attractants are birdfeeders, unsecured garbage and compost piles which include food scraps. Livestock, such as chickens and pigs, can also attract bears when not properly protected. Electric fencing is the most effective way to protect livestock. In most cases removing the attractant the bear(s) are utilizing eliminates the bear problem. It is also helpful to harass bears with noise, such as banging pots and pans, or using compressed air horns to scare them away.
