

With the start of the summer season people are using their "toys" that require trailers while enjoying all of the opportunities that the Lakes Region has to offer. While everyone is enjoying this season, the City's Zoning Enforcement office would just like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten in the summer heat.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line.



For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front yard. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Don't forget that includes those items that are intended for the snow (like snowmobiles), even though it's too early to think about that!

Public Works Department

As part of the Court Street Roadway Improvement Project, the City's contractor, Busby Construction, will be doing night work to upgrade the sewer mains at the intersection of Fair Street and Court Street. The work is scheduled for Sunday, July 1 and Monday, July 2 and will begin at 6pm and last through the night.

There is no planned disruption to water or sewer services. Traffic will be detoured. The work is being done after hours to take advantage of low flow in the sewer pipes and to minimize traffic disruptions.



The 4th of July is almost here and the Laconia Fire Department wants to remind people to be very careful when celebrating our Independence Day, especially if you are going to use fireworks. Only permissible fireworks are allowed in Laconia, unless you are a licensed fireworks operator. Fireworks can be dangerous. Do not get complacent when using these explosives! According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), on Independence Day in a typical year more fires are reported across the country than any other day, and fireworks account for half of those fires. Six years ago, in Laconia we had an apartment house get destroyed by fire because of misuse of sparklers. Always be alert to the recent weather conditions; if it has not rained in a few days, then the ground cover will be dry, as will the rain gutters on your house, and your neighbor's house. Fireworks have landed on roofs and rolled down into the gutter and started fires.



Every year thousands of people are injured using fireworks. Adult males and teenagers are the most susceptible to injury. The injuries can be very severe. The best way to celebrate the holiday is to go to a public fireworks display. Check the newspapers to see what communities are providing fireworks displays. This year in the Laconia area there are fireworks shows on July 3 at Weirs Beach at 11:59 pm and on July 7 at Opechee Park at 9:30 pm.

If you do plan on using permissible fireworks you must be over 21 years of age and you must own the property or have the owner's permission. Permissible fireworks are allowed in Laconia. They may not be allowed in other communities. Keep children away from the fireworks especially while lighting them. Watch where the fireworks land and monitor the area for at least 30 minutes after you are done. Fireworks can land on roofs and in gutters and easily start a fire.

The State Fire Marshal gives this advice:

Be Prepared before lighting fireworks.

Purchase only New Hampshire Permissible Fireworks, available at licensed retail stores throughout the state.

Purchase ONLY the quantity that you will use.

Permissible fireworks can ONLY be displayed on property that you own, or with written permission from the landowner.

Contact your local fire department to check the daily forest fire weather forecast, or if outside burning has been prohibited.

Have a water hose or fire extinguisher nearby in case of an unanticipated fire.

Create a clear level surface to display your permissible fireworks away from things that can burn, or easily ignite.

Call 911 immediately in the event of a fire or medical emergency, don't wait!

Be Safe when lighting fireworks.

Adults 21 years of age or older are the only ones allowed to possess and display permissible fireworks.

Always wear eye, hearing protection and gloves.

Always read and follow the safety directions provided on each firework device or package and ask the store for additional information.

Light only one device at a time and move away quickly.

Keep all spectators at a safe distance.

Display permissible fireworks only outdoors, away from anything that can burn or easily ignite.

Be considerate of your neighbors, family pets and the environment. You can be held liable for damage to another's property.

"Be responsible" - when finished:

Clean up all debris when you are finished.

Devices that do not fire or discharge once they are lit are very dangerous; if a firework device does not fire or discharge, keep away for at least 15 minutes or more, then ensure that it has been filled with water or placed in a bucket of water.

Always make sure that unused fireworks, matches and lighters are secured and out of the reach of children.

Please, **"Be Prepared"**, **"Be Safe"**, and **"Be Responsible"** when using Permissible Consumer Fireworks, and celebrate safely this Fourth of July!







News From the City Clerk's Office



Per [Per State RSA, Title XLV, Chapter 466](#) all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the City Clerk prior to April 30th. A late fee of \$1/month is assessed for those dogs not registered by that date. **Beginning July 1st, a civil fine of \$25 is due.** If the fine is not paid within 15 calendar days of the notice of forfeiture, the case may be forwarded to the District Court as a violation with a fine not to exceed \$50. Fees for registering dogs are shown below:

Late charge per month as of June 1:	\$ 1.00
Civil fine for failure to register by April 30 will begin July 1st:	\$25.00
Altered dog (or puppy under 7 mo. old):	\$ 6.50
Unaltered dog:	\$ 9.00
Senior (1st dog for owners over 65):	\$ 2.00
Replacement tag:	\$ 1.00




