FALL Book Discussion Series


THIS IS US : STORIES OF AMERICAN IDENTITY

Searing and unforgettable, *The Line Becomes a River* goes behind the headlines, making urgent and personal the violence our border wreaks on both sides of the line.


The discussion will be led by Scholar and former University of New Hampshire Professor, Jennifer Lee.


