



WOW Trail Volunteer Cleanup



On April 18th supported by WOW Trail Volunteers & Laconia High School's Huot Tech Center students, the trail at Moulton St., Laconia received a thorough clean-up including trash collection, tree trimming and chipping of the cuttings.



WOW Trail Volunteers did all the cutting, most of it prior to the clean-up event. BLC Tree Service crews operated a commercial chipper, creating recycled wood chip mulch for use along the Trail.

Laconia High School Principal Steven Beals and Huot Director Scott Davis arranged for transport in the Center's minibuses for Huot Tech Center teacher Matt Towle, Plumbing & Heating teacher Michael Schofield and their entire classes! Huot has students from other area schools enrolled as well.

These students did all the heavy lifting – the clean-up would not have been possible without them. Kevin Dunleavy, the City's Director of Recreation & Facilities, provided courtesy trash bags and agreed to pick up and properly dispose of all of the trash and materials.

An incredible amount of trash was collected, and Trail users are now greeted with an fabulous view of the water along that section of the Trail. Thanks to everyone for their hard work on this project!

News From the Laconia Water Dept.

Water Main Upgrade

The Water Department would like to thank all of our customers for their cooperation during the water main upgrade under the railroad tracks at the intersection of Fair Street and Winnisquam Avenue.

This project was initiated by the New Hampshire Department of Transportation as they were doing a complete rehabilitation of the railroad crossing. The Water Department, in conjunction with Public Works, took advantage of this opportunity to upgrade the infrastructures.

The Water Department was able to replace about 110 feet of early 1900's 6-inch cast iron pipe with new 8-inch Ductile Iron Cement Lined pipe including a 16-inch steel sleeve with 10-inch high density polyurethane carrier pipe under the railroad tracks.

This job went well, especially considering the time constraint and also all the other obstacles that were in the way (other utilities such as gas, sewer, drain, etc.). The Water Department was all finished with their portion of work by late Tuesday, April 17, 2012 and the road was open for traffic the next afternoon.

The Department will be conducting a similar upgrade under the railroad tracks on Weeks Street. This work is scheduled for the month of May. More information on this particular job will be available shortly.



Winter-Spring Dynamic Book Discussion Series

The fourth discussion in the Library's Winter-Spring Dynamic Book Discussion Series will be held on Tuesday, May 1st at 7:00 p.m. in Laconia Rotary Hall and will focus on *Caleb's Crossing* by Geraldine Brooks.

The book tells the tale of Caleb Cheeshahetaumauk, the first Native American to graduate from Harvard. The story is told by Berthia Mayfield, the daughter of a preacher who traveled from England to Martha's Vineyard to try and bring Christ to the Indians. In 1660 when Berthia is 12, the family takes Caleb, a Wampanoag Indian, into their home to prepare him for boarding school. Berthia is a bright scholar herself, and although education for women is discouraged, she absorbs the lessons taught to Caleb and her brother Makepeace like a sponge. She struggles through the death of her mother, a younger sister, another brother and her father.

When Caleb and Makepeace are sent to Cambridge, Berthia accompanies them as an indentured servant to a professor. She marries a Harvard scholar, journeys with him to Padua, and finally returns to her beloved island. In flashbacks, Brooks relates the woes of the Indian Wars, the smallpox epidemic, and Caleb's untimely death shortly after his graduation with honors.

The novel displays Brook's uncanny ability to reconstruct moments of history with lyrical prose. The discussion leader will be Frumie Selchen. Copies of the book are available at the Library's main circulation desk. For more information please call 524-4775 x12.

City Council News...

In an effort to encourage recycling and control solid waste costs in the City of Laconia, the City Council has been discussing amendments to Chapter 194, Solid Waste. A public hearing has been scheduled for the Council's May 14, 2012 meeting which begins at 7:00 pm in Room 200A at City Hall.



Following are the major changes included in the revised Ordinance:

- 1) The tipping fee at the Transfer Station will increase from \$30/ton to \$60/ton effective July 1, 2012, and will increase to \$90/ton the following July 1, 2013. If approved, this change will become effective July 1, 2012.
- 2) Currently, five trash containers are allowed in front of a single family residences and ten containers per business location are allowed. This applies to those families and businesses on curbside pickup. If approved, the number of containers allowed will be reduced to two containers per single family residence and seven containers per business; this change would become effective October 1, 2012.

There are numerous other changes proposed in the Amendments to the Solid Waste Chapter. Please click [here](#) to view the proposed changes and the document in its entirety.

You are encouraged to attend this public hearing to voice your concerns, ask questions and provide input to help find a solution to the City's solid waste issues.
