From the City Clerk's Office

Updated information on the NH DMV's Decal Plate program! Several new organizations have been approved for the program (see below). In a recent newsletter we provided information on this newest plate type. As noted, decal plates resemble regular New Hampshire passenger license plate however, they include a 3"x3" blank square on the left side of the plate that allows for the placement of a special decal issued by a 501(c)(3) organization authorized by the legislature. Legislatively authorized organizations may sell decals for a cost. Decals are NOT available at DMV locations, they have to be purchased directly from the legislatively authorized 501(c)(3) organizations. Decals can only be placed on a Decal Plate. To transfer your existing passenger plate to a Decal Plate, please visit any of the DMV locations. To obtain a new Decal Plate, please visit your town or city clerk office.

Decal Plates are available for a \$15 fee per year in addition to the town and state registration fees. Decal Vanity Plates are also available for an additional \$40 vanity plate fee. An additional \$8.00 plate manufacturing fee is only required in the first year of purchase. Here is a list of organizations approved by the Legislature: The following organizations have been approved by the legislature during the 2017 legislative session, and several new ones have now been added: University of New Hampshire Foundation, Current/Retired Firefighters, NH Rotary, Daniel Webster Council of Boy Scouts of America, New England Patriots Charitable Foundation, Inc., Granite Pathways, NH Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Association, Friends of the Hampton Falls Bandstand, Inc., Seacoast Youth Services, NH Catholic Charities, New Hampshire Food Bank, New England Donor Services, Inc., Sophia's Fund, NH Breast Cancer Coalition, and the University System of New Hampshire (Granite State College, Keene State College, Plymouth State University). Pipe Organ 'Crawl' coming Oct. 21

Bob Bengtson, organist at the Laconia Congregational church, will host a Pipe Organ Crawl, Sunday afternoon, Oct. 21, sponsored by the New Hampshire Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

"On these occasions" Bengtson says, "organists come from near and far to experience three or four different instruments. It is an informal time during which players try out some of their favorite pieces." For church members and friends, and others interested in the pipe organ, "it is fun to see and hear the varied approaches of multiple performers on the same organ." Organs to be heard range from relatively large and modern to historic, tracker-action American instruments and one built in England.

The event is free and open to the public. Visitors can attend any or all of the churches as follows: 2:30 p.m., Congregational Church of Laconia; 3:15 p.m., South Baptist Church; 4 p.m., Sacred Heart Church; and 4:45 p.m., United Baptist Church, Lakeport.



4 ingredient baked fish with tomato and basil sauce

Ingredients:

- 1 1/4 –1 1/2 lbs cod or halibut fillets
- 1 (28oz) can diced tomato (do not drain)
- 2 TBSP freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 1/2 cup packed, chopped fresh basil leaves, divided
- Salt and pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Spray a large baking dish with cooking spray.
2. Pat fillets dry and place fish in dish (skin-side down, if there is skin on them). Pour tomatoes into dish and spread around the fish. Sprinkle with half of the basil and drizzle with lemon juice.
3. Season the entire dish with salt and pepper, to taste
4. Bake, uncovered, until fish is opaque and cooked through (about 15 minutes)


