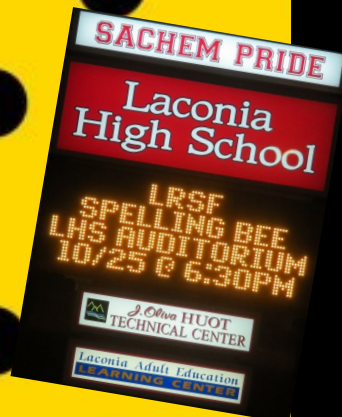

Updates from the Planning Office...

At The Change of Seasons, Where's Your Trailer?

With the end of the warmer weather and winter just around the corner, people are moving their grownup "toys" that require trailers. If you're looking to store your summer toys or getting your winter fun ready, the City's Zoning Enforcement Office would like to remind residents there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten during these busy times.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include any kind of trailers, including campers, boats, trailers with either jet skis or snow machines, any motorized recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) requires that these items be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the City Zoning Ordinance [§ 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.](#))

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards, including the driveway area in front of the house.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Failure to comply with the Zoning Ordinance can lead to fines or court action. Questions? Call the Planning Office at 527-1264.

The Commission of Three Persons, in accordance with RSA 230:14 and the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987 (as amended), has set a public hearing to discuss proposed improvements to rehabilitate the substructure and replace the concrete slab superstructure of the bridge carrying US Rte. 3 over NH Railroad (Br. No. 131/154).

There are intersections on each side of the bridge, one with Lakeside Ave. and US Rte. 3, and the other with Channel Lane and US Rte. 3. There will also be associated approach roadway work. Total project length including both bridge and roadway is 125 feet.

The meeting will be held at Laconia City Hall, 45 Beacon Street East, Laconia, NH on November 5, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

**THE BUILDING WILL BE OPEN AT 6:30 P.M. FOR THE
INSPECTION OF PLANS BY ANY INTERESTED PERSONS.**

On October 3, 2018, the Governor and Executive Council authorized the petition of the Bureau of Right-of-Way for a Public Hearing on this project, including the appointment of a Commission of Three Persons. The Commission shall determine whether there is occasion for the rehabilitation of the bridge as presented at the hearing.

Notice is hereby given to said Petitioners and the owners of land over which said highway may pass, and to all others interested by posting a like copy in at least two (2) public places in the City of Laconia and leaving a like copy with the City Clerk at least fourteen (14) days before the said day of hearing.

Relocation assistance will be furnished to each owner or tenant whose improvements or property will be acquired for this project based on their eligibility.

Interested landowners, local officials and highway users are welcome and will be given the opportunity to express their comments relative to the project. The testimony will be recorded.

This project may impact historic properties. This project is tentatively scheduled for advertising for bids on March 19, 2019.

Maps, plans, the environmental studies and other pertinent information developed by the Department, along with written views received as a result of the coordination with other agencies, are available at the Department of Transportation at the John O. Morton Building, 7 Hazen Drive, Concord, New Hampshire for inspection and copying. It is suggested you call Bob Landry, Administrator, Bridge Design, at (603) 271-3921 in advance for an appointment.

Immediately after the Hearing, the Commission may reconvene for a meeting to discuss the proposed project. This meeting is a public proceeding under RSA Chapter 91-A. The intent of this meeting is not to continue taking testimony as was done at the Public Hearing, but instead the meeting serves as a decision-making forum for the Commission. The public may observe the proceedings.

If the Commission requires additional time to consider the presented testimony, a Finding of Necessity meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, December 4, 2018 at 9:00 AM in Room 112/113, John O. Morton Building, 7 Hazen Drive, Concord, NH.

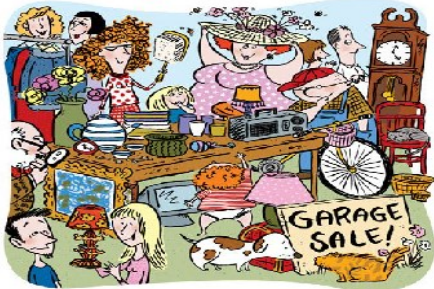

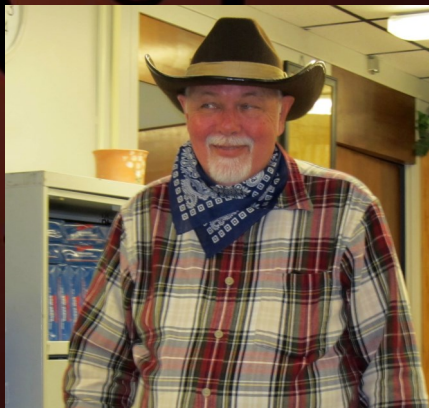
