Public Works Department News!

Final Construction Program Update for 2018 and Early Projections for 2019

2018 was a busy construction year in Laconia. The City's annual construction program included reconstruction of most of Pleasant Street, the remainder of Merrimac and a block of Bowman. It also included resurfacing some streets in the City.

The **Court Street** project was very busy this summer with 8 utilities performing their work so that the City could reconstruct the road. The weather did not cooperate and we could not finish this year. We are going to do some temporary connections to catch basins to minimize street flooding and pave the road before winter for a smooth-riding, plowable surface. Next year, the contractor has about 5 weeks of work to prepare and pave the road, and another 5 weeks of sidewalk and cleanup type work.

Union Ave. Project - Elm St. to Stark St. The Union Ave./Elm Street intersection is critical to our traffic control plans for the project, so we started the utility work this fall to ensure the contractor would have enough time to complete the work in the intersection to open it for full use by Memorial Day.

Next spring the contractor will work on the section from Elm St. to Walnut and next fall will work on the section from Walnut St. to Stark. The City expects that some work will continue during the summer, but we will probably not be working in the road bed.

Union Ave. - Main St. to Gilford Ave. work begins next year. It will be coordinated with the work on Court St. Both the City water and sewer systems have long sections of their lines to replace and we know that we are going to have to deal with bedrock to get pipe in the ground. One of the utilities will have to begin while Court St. is underway, but we are still working on the timing. More to follow on this project as we coordinate activities next year.

We will be working on our resurfacing plans over the winter and expect to have a draft plan available in late January.

Wills and Estates, by Dorcas Gordon, November 14th



Come get the facts on Estate Law in an informative presentation by Dorcas Gordon, Wednesday, Nov. 14 at 2 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Theater. The event is free and open to the public.

Gordon will focus on estate planning documents that all individuals should have in place, including Revocable Trusts, Last Wills and Testaments, Durable Powers of Attorney for financial matters and Durable Powers of Attorney for Healthcare, and Living Will Declarations. She will discuss how correct use of these documents can avoid probate and guardianship proceedings, and highlight recent changes in the law, which may make it necessary for individuals to update their current documents. Questions from the audience will be welcome.

Lecture on Henri Chapelle American Cemetery, November 14th

Seven years ago, Aimee Fogg traveled to Belgium to learn about her great-uncle's death in World War II. Today she has a new appreciation for life – and a growing collection of adopted relatives. The men and women she now considers family share one thing in common: a loved one buried at Henri Chapelle American Cemetery in Hamburg, Belgium.



By the end of the war, it was the largest temporary American cemetery in Europe. Many of the 17,000 soldiers have been returned to the United States for burial, but nearly 8,000 remain. Fogg, who lives in Gilford, has collected stories and photos about the 40 New Hampshire men and the 24 from Vermont buried at Henri-Chapelle and published them in a pair of books. She's now documenting the accounts of 54 soldiers from Maine. Come hear her story in a lecture scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 14 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building. This free event is open to the public.



The History of the Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction

In 1982, WLNH radio host Bailey, responding to the needs of Lakes Region Children and their families, created a two-day fundraising broadcast from the WLNH van in front of the Laconia YMCA. They raised \$2,100 and collected a number of items for donation to the "Citizen Santa Fund."

Over the next 15 years, WLNH worked tirelessly to grow this event into a multi-day radio auction. Through the generosity of several different proprietors, the Auction found a home each year in storefronts throughout Downtown Laconia. Under WLNH's direction, multitudes became involved in this event and the "Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction" took on a life of its own.

The City's Corrugated Cardboard Compactor is now in Operation!

The site is open 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. It is located at 257 Messer Street, the site of one of the former remote recycling locations.

For safety reasons we do not allow the public to load the cardboard into the compactor. Corrugated cardboard must be broken down and put into

the enclosure next to the compactor. This site can accept any form of clean corrugated cardboard such as shipping boxes from Amazon, Walmart and other stores.

We cannot accept:

Pizza boxes as they have been contaminated with remains of the pizza.

Paperboard such as:

Cereal boxes

Shoe boxes

Soda and beer boxes

All loose plastic must be removed from the cardboard such as:

Bubble wrap

Air pillows



Corrugated cardboard must be broken down and put into the enclosure by the compactor through the slots in the fence. Please do not stack boxes outside of the fence.

The City pays over \$90 a ton to process recycling material for sale. Corrugated cardboard is most of the City's recycling tonnage. Using the compactor site will reduce this tonnage as it enables the City to by-pass the processing center and send it directly to a cardboard recycler at a much lower cost. Bringing your corrugated cardboard to the compactor will help ensure that recycling does not impact the ability of the City to provide its services to its residents.

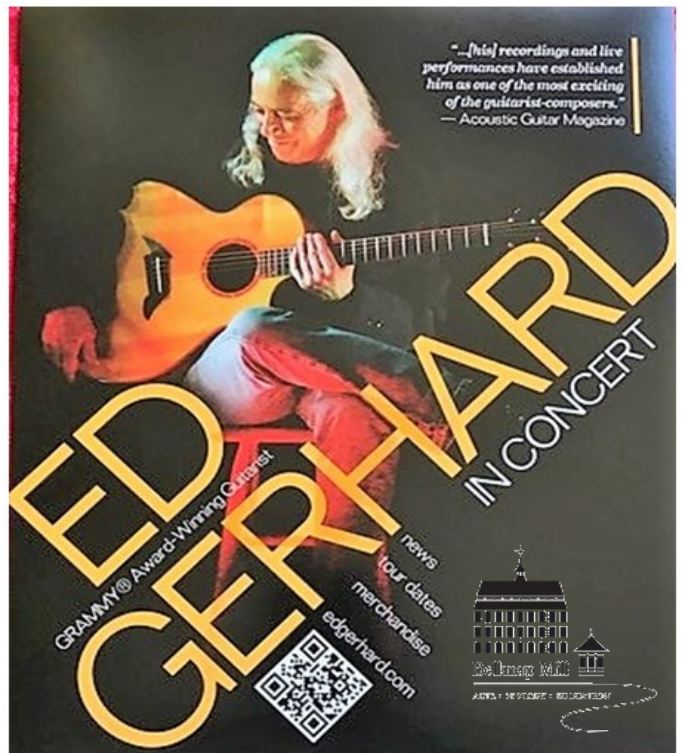
