Jillian Hildreth Fox is a Laconia native, now residing in Concord, NH. Jillian recalls that although she has been doodling forever, it wasn't until she was asked to sign her "artwork" by a waiter when she absentmindedly doodled on a paper placemat while enjoying lunch with her son in Boston, that she realized maybe these aren't just *doodles*.

She admits that it can be compulsive and shares that it is a way for her to deal with the stress of the last couple years. Interestingly, she notices that the more chaotic things around her become, the more elaborate the design will be.

The entirety of Jillian's intricate patterns are done free hand, without planning or forethought and in mostly black ink. Jillian says, "I have a sketch pad in my possession or at arm's reach everywhere I go. Except that time I left it on the roof of my car and drove away as it flew into traffic."

The City's Corrugated Cardboard Compactor is now in Operation!



The site is open 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. It is located at 257 Messer Street, the site of one of the former remote recycling locations.

For safety reasons we do not allow the public to load the cardboard into the compactor. Corrugated cardboard must be broken down and put into the enclosure next to the compactor. This site can accept any form of clean corrugated cardboard such as shipping boxes from Amazon, Walmart and other stores.

We cannot accept:

Pizza boxes as they have been contaminated with remains of the pizza.

Paperboard such as:


Cereal boxes
Shoe boxes
Soda and beer boxes

All loose plastic must be removed from the cardboard such as:

Bubble wrap
Air pillows

Corrugated cardboard must be broken down and put into the enclosure by the compactor through the slots in the fence. Please do not stack boxes outside of the fence.

The City pays over \$90 a ton to process recycling material for sale. Corrugated cardboard is most of the City's recycling tonnage. Using the compactor site will reduce this tonnage as it enables the City to by-pass the processing center and send it directly to a cardboard recycler at a much lower cost. Bringing your corrugated cardboard to the compactor will help ensure that recycling does not impact the ability of the City to provide its services to its residents.
