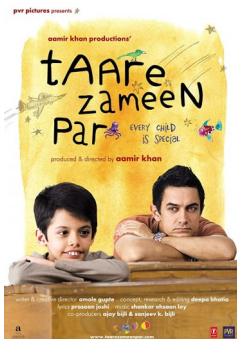

**Monthly Craft Newsletter:** A sneak preview of what's coming for our monthly craft program, adult coloring, or soothing stitches programs.

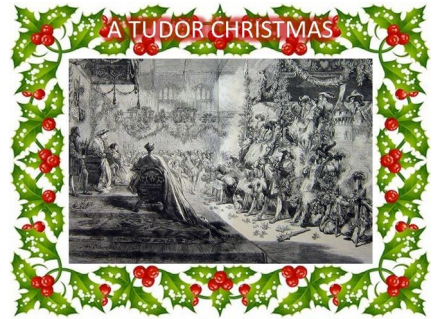
