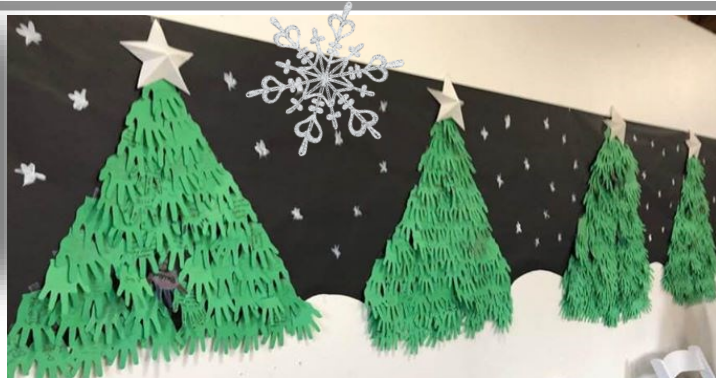

Recycling Update Department of Public Works

Nationwide there has been a major change in the Recycling program! The firms that purchase the material that is the result of resident recycling are only interested in quality, not the quantity of the product. Processing resident recycling used to be free but now we are paying over \$90 a ton which is more than the cost of disposal. The City Council recognizes that continuing the recycling program is the right thing to do. They are asking all residents to ensure that only material that is actually recyclable goes into your bins.

Please do not recycle:

Plastic bags (they can only be recycled at grocery stores) or any flimsy plastic, no matter its number
Pizza boxes

Glass (There is not market for it. Any glass that goes into the recycling container will be sent to a landfill at a higher cost to the City)

Any plastic that does not have recycling numbers 1 through 5
5 gallon pails (the pails that paint comes in)

If you are not sure if an item can be recycled, throw it in the trash!

PROPERTY TAX BILLS WERE MAILED 12/3/18!

Property tax bills will be mailed on Monday, Dec. 3, 2018. They are due on January 2, 2019.

Payments are accepted by mail and at the counter in City Hall during normal business hours. Office hours are Monday – Friday 8:30-4:30. For your convenience there is a drop slot located on the side door of City Hall. We are now accepting credit cards over the counter and online. Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover are accepted.

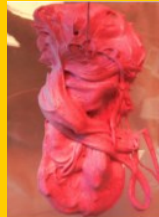

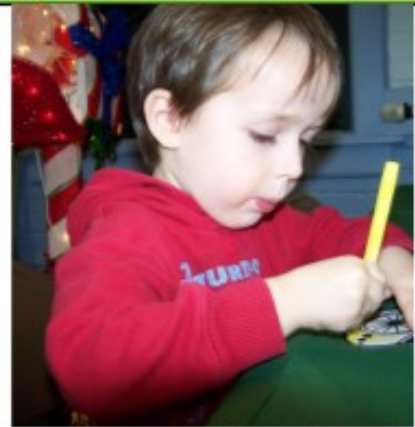

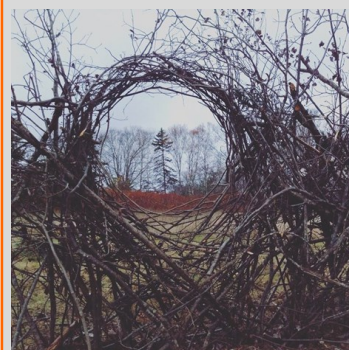
Christmas Caroling!

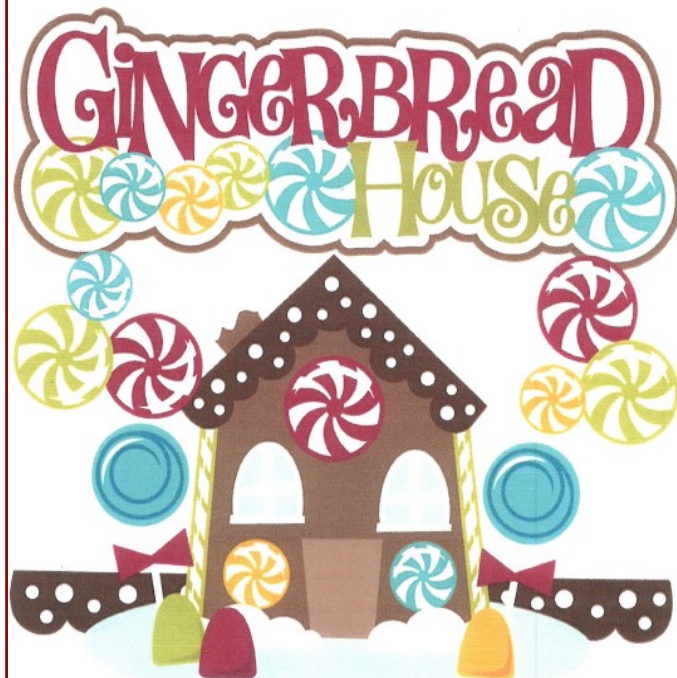
Advent Soup and Study at the Congregational Church of Laconia

LRCD Installs Solar at Laconia Property

Lakes Region Community Developers (LRCD) installed a solar system in November at their Avery Hill affordable housing development. Avery Hill is a cluster of duplexes on Grove Street and Lougee Court near the LRGHealthcare campus in Laconia.

Census and federal energy data show that energy expenditures by low-income households in the Lakes Region eat up 34% to 37% of household income. "Our goal with this project is to ensure that total housing and utility costs at Avery Hill remain affordable well into the future so that our tenants don't have to choose between paying their electric bill and buying groceries or medicine," said Carmen Lorentz, LRCD's Executive Director. The Avery Hill solar system eliminates the electric bill for 12 households.

Funding for the project was provided by the Thomas W. Haas Fund of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation, NH's Renewable Energy Fund, and NH Community Development Finance Authority's Clean Energy Fund. The array was installed by ReVision Energy.

Karen Cramton, Director of the Sustainable Energy Division of the NH Public Utilities Commission, states "Avery Hill is one of the first projects to be awarded a grant from the new Low and Moderate Income Community Solar Competitive Grant program supported by the Renewable Energy Fund. This project demonstrates that solar energy has a meaningful direct benefit for low and moderate income families."

Katy Easterly Martey, Executive Director of NH Community Development Finance Authority said, "Our Clean Energy Fund exists to help organizations be efficient operators and good stewards of the environment. The Avery Hill solar project will reduce LRCD's carbon footprint, contribute to the organization's sustainability and furthering of its mission, and benefit the families they serve."

Lakes Region Community Developers (LRCD) is a non-profit organization whose mission is to create opportunities for the Lakes Region to thrive by building healthy homes, creating vibrant community assets, and engaging residents.

LRCD provides healthy housing to 365 families throughout the region so they can live in safe, affordable, energy efficient homes that provide a healthy foundation for success in work, school, and community. Avery Hill was the first property that LRCD redeveloped in 1993.

**Volunteers are needed in Franklin and Laconia
for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program!**

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program, or VITA, provides free income tax preparation for low-to-moderate income working people.

- **Who does the program serve?**
 - Your neighbors! Working people with an average household income of about \$24,800/year;
- **Why is it important?**
 - Many people go to commercial tax preparers when they do not need to, paying between \$200-\$300 for a simple tax return;
 - Many people are eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), however according to IRS and estimated one-in-four eligible filers don't claim this support for working families.
- The EITC and Child Tax Credit combined to lift more than 16,000 NH residents, including more than 8,000 children, out of poverty in each of the last three years, according to the Center for Budget and Policy Priorities.

Granite United Way (GUW) operates VITA sites in Franklin and Laconia as well as in Manchester, Salem, Concord, Littleton and White River Junction and needs your help to serve more people. Last year, a GUW-led effort helped more than 5,000 filers claim their full refund. We are limited only by the number of volunteers who give their time to this effort.

Our specific needs are for:

- **Intake Specialists**—Greet tax filers, conduct an intake review to make sure all documents are present for a complete and accurate tax return, and offer resources for other financial needs filers may have;
- **Tax Preparers**—No previous tax or finance experience necessary, just a computer aptitude and a willingness to learn. Training and software are provided.

Volunteers are expected to complete standards of conduct certification, and commit about 3-5 hours every week or every other week from January until early April.
