"It's spring cleaning season...can I leave large household items at the curb to be picked up?"

Answer: Yes! Both metal and non-metal bulky items can be picked up curbside and require "Bulky Item" stickers. Stickers are available for \$6 each at the City Clerk's office (45 Beacon St. East, Mon-Fri, 8:30-4:30). Non-metal bulky items are collected on your normal trash day. Metal items are collected once a month. Please call the DPW office at 528-6379 to register for pickup of metal bulky items. Freon-containing items (such as refrigerators, dehumidifiers, etc.) and electronics are **NOT ELIGIBLE** for curbside pickup.


In this series, we will explore how the written word, the expression of movement, and the language of music can reveal private truths and act as confession.



New England Wolves are the EHLP 2018-19 Champions

In Providence, RI on Sunday, March 24, 2019 with a strong fan showing of Laconia faithful in attendance, the New England Wolves defeated the Philadelphia Little Flyers 4-2, to win the 2018-19 Eastern Hockey League Premier Championship!

"It took time, but this team learned how to win." commented EHLP Head Coach Andrew Trimble. "They came together at the right time. I am incredibly proud of what they accomplished."

Held at Schneider Arena on the campus of Providence College, the EHLP championship pitted the Southern Conference Champion (Little Flyers) versus the Northern Conference Champion (Wolves) in a one game, winner take all showdown. The Wolves had swept the CT Chiefs and Boston JR Rangers in earlier series to earn the championship final appearance.

In period 1, Wolves Captain Jack Johansen scored first. The 2000 birth year defender from NH was awarded "Defenseman of the Year" in the EHLP earlier this week. In period 2, the Little Flyers took the lead, 2-1, but the Wolves would not be deterred. In period 3, Herbert Ziebots tied the game at 2 mid-way through the period, before EHLP Finals MVP, Alex Carpenter, would bury two successive goals as the Wolves would claim the 4-2 victory. Ryan Fueg was stellar in nets again, earning his 5th victory of the post- season.

"Wolves ownership would like to thank all of our fans both young and old for all their support throughout this post- season." said EHLP Head Coach Tim Kunes. "Thank you to our players, parents, sponsors and supporters."







Zoning Updates Proposed, Public Hearings Scheduled

The City of Laconia is proposing some significant zoning changes as part of the Master Plan updates adopted last year. There will be two PUBLIC HEARINGS at the Planning Board on Tuesday, April 2, at 6:30pm in Laconia City Hall for those wishing to comment on the proposals.

The first proposal is to create a consolidated zone to include all of the Downtown and adjacent areas. Just how much of the adjacent areas will be incorporated into this new zone has yet to be determined, but it will encompass areas significantly beyond what most people would consider the traditional Downtown. Currently, the Downtown is divided into several distinct zoning districts, each with their own set of rules concerning setbacks, density, permitted uses, and even sign sizes. The goal of the new consolidated Downtown zone is to have one set of zoning rules equally applied to all properties and to alleviate restrictions to help drive rehab and expansion activity.

The second proposal is to institute a concept known as Performance Zoning in certain areas of the City. The idea behind Performance Zoning is to have property owners propose a use or uses for a property to the Planning Board, and if the Board believes it's a good proposal, the property would not be subject to many of the usual zoning restrictions; however, all environmental restrictions would remain in place. The goal of this proposal would be to help drive quality, innovative economic development in the City. Performance Zoning would apply in the new Downtown Zone proposed above, in the area including and immediately adjacent to the old State School property off Parade Road, and the Lakeport area.
