**Important Message
from the Laconia
Fire Department**

***Open burning permits are now required in Laconia for the 2019 season.
This includes camp fires, cooking fires and brush piles.
There is no charge for burn permits.***

Permits can be obtained at either the Laconia Central Fire Station located at 848 North Main Street, or the Weirs Beach Fire Station at 11 Lucerne Avenue.

Only the property owner can obtain a burning permit, unless a Laconia Fire Department Non-Property Owner Authorization form has been filled out and signed. These forms are available at both stations.

- Open burning with a permit is allowed from 5pm to 9am
- The fire must be attended
- You must have sufficient water available to control/extinguish the fire
- Only certain materials can be burned including but not limited to untreated wood and brush 5" or less in diameter. **NO** burning of treated woods, trash, cardboard, or plastics (a complete list is available when permit is obtained)
- Category I (campfire/cooking fire) must be at least 25 feet from structures, and Category II or greater fires must be 50 feet from structures.

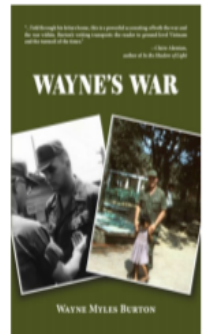

WAYNE'S WAR: A CHRONICLE OF THE VIETNAM EXPERIENCE

Thursday, April 11
6:30pm
Laconia Rotary Hall

Wayne's War by Wayne Myles Burton chronicles his experience as a staff officer and company commander in the 9th Infantry Division during Operation Speedy Express in 1968-69 in the Mekong Delta. Grounded in the 240 letters he wrote to his wife during this time, as well as experiences before and since, he describes the conflict between duty and conscience he encountered at a personal level that the country experienced nationally, both during the Vietnam War and the decades that follow. His unit's mission of winning the hearts and minds of the people through mechanisms bordering on genocide begets his disillusionment, causing him to rethink most of what he'd been taught to believe. His later life builds on his new beliefs, sending him on pathways he never anticipated before participating in the war. Burton served almost five decades in higher education leadership, his last thirteen as President of North Shore Community College (Massachusetts). He has been a legislator, a town councilor, and a community activist. Books will be available for purchase and signing after the presentation.

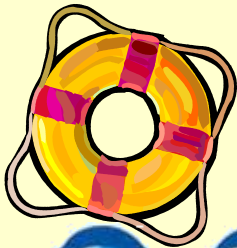
Now is a Good Time to Get Your Boat & Jet Ski Registration!

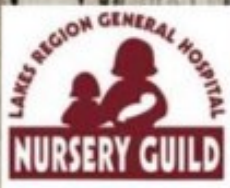

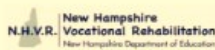

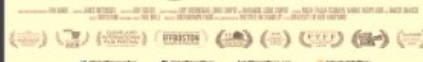
