From the Planning/Zoning Department...

Think Twice Before Buying
Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute? However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens, are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City website or call the Planning office at 524-1264 to find out. A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!

Notes from the Public Works Dept.



Our "City Recyclers", whether residents or businesses, are the key to a successful recycling program. If Recyclers follow a few easy steps, this will ensure the City's recycling program is successful and affordable:

Know what to throw: Items that are not recyclable when placed in a recycling container increase the City's cost of recycling as Laconia not only pays to have non-recyclable items processed through the recycling system, but also pays for the cost of disposing of the items.

Recyclable containers should be empty, clean and dry and should not have any tops on them. The tops are made of a different material than the bottle. If they are still on the bottle, both the bottle and cap are treated as contaminated and are sent to the landfill.

Keep it loose: Do not place recyclables in plastic bags. Plastic bags are not recyclable in our single stream system. Since the process does not know what is in the bag, to protect their employees and equipment, the bag and ALL of its contents are treated as trash and are landfilled.





News from the Public Works Dept.

It's that time of the year and many residents and businesses have begun their plans to have their driveways and parking lots repaved. Driveway permits are issued by Public Works, located at 27 Bisson Ave. Please keep in mind that obtaining your driveway permit is easier if you have everything the City needs to review your request when you come to the appropriate City Office.

Larger multi-family complexes (greater than duplex) and commercial property owners must start the permit process at the Planning Department in City Hall to determine if their plans meet City zoning regulations. Please bring a sketch or plans of the existing pavement (if any) and of the proposed pavement. Planning will review the concept to ensure your plans meet the City's green space as well as setback and any other zoning regulations. After ensuring your proposal meets the City's zoning regulations, Planning notifies Public Works that they can issue your driveway permit.

Single family residential and duplex property owners can go directly to the Public Works office to obtain a permit. Please bring a sketch or plans of the existing pavement (if any) and of the proposed pavement. Public Works will review your pavement plan to determine if your plan meets the City's green space and driveway length zoning requirements. Public Works will also review your plan to determine if it conforms with the City's driveway policy. If your plan conforms to the City's driveway policy and meets greenspace and length requirements, Public Works will issue you a permit. If your plan does not meet either zoning regulations or the City's driveway policy, Public Works will explain the next steps that you must take to obtain a driveway permit.




CNC Operator Boot Camp

This course is designed for an unexperienced individual to gain all the skills and knowledge to proficiently operate three and four axis CNC milling machines in a fast-paced production environment. This course adds value to an employer as they will not have to spend precious time and resources training the employee. During the six-week non-credit course the student will

learn and practice the following skills in a mock production environment:

- Workplace soft skills, Basic Machining Vocabulary, Machine Safety, including OSHA standards, LOTO, and PPE
- Importance of Lot Control and Work Orders
- 5S in the workplace
- Basic machine tool math
- Intro to Metrology, including basic use of:
 - Calipers
 - Micrometers
 - Height Gage/Dial Indicator
 - MicroHite
 - Knowing when to use each measurement tool
- Basic Blueprint Reading and understanding tolerances
- Importance of Quality Control
 - Checking parts critical dimensions
- Understanding tooling



NH Periodic Motor Vehicle Inspection Seminar is a learning experience that combines online study of inspection rules with eight hours of hands-on practice performing the various tasks required to complete an official vehicle safety inspection and emission inspection.

Participants will complete an on-line course of study followed by two four-hour hands-on modules that start at 5:00 PM and end at 9:00 PM. Participants must be able to access the internet to open the Motor Vehicle Inspection course on CCSNH Canvas learning management system and complete the desk exercises before the hands-on exercises.

Outcomes: The successful learner will...

- demonstrate knowledge of NH State Inspection rules and requirements.
- demonstrate the ability to perform a NH State Inspection following a logical sequence.
- demonstrate the ability to check steering linkage and suspension component wear using a dial indicator to the nearest 0.001"
- demonstrate the ability to measure rotor thickness using an outside micrometer.
- demonstrate the ability to check headlamp aim using the CVA EZ headlamp aimer.
- demonstrate the ability to properly check tire condition and tread wear using the tread depth gauge to the nearest 1/32 inch.
- demonstrate the ability to inspect brake lining thickness using brake lining thickness gauges.
- demonstrate the ability to measure brake drum diameter using the Ammco brake drum micrometer to the nearest 0.005"
- demonstrate the ability to determine window tinting light admittance.
